

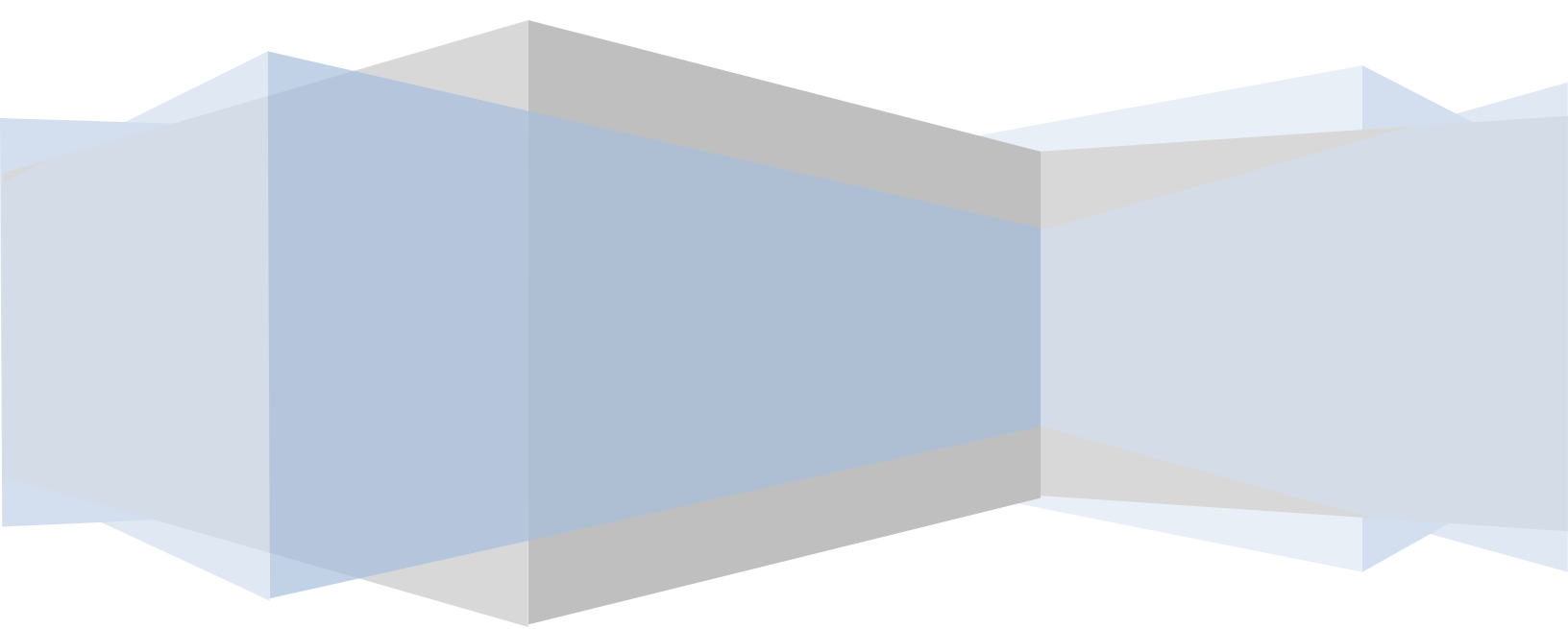

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

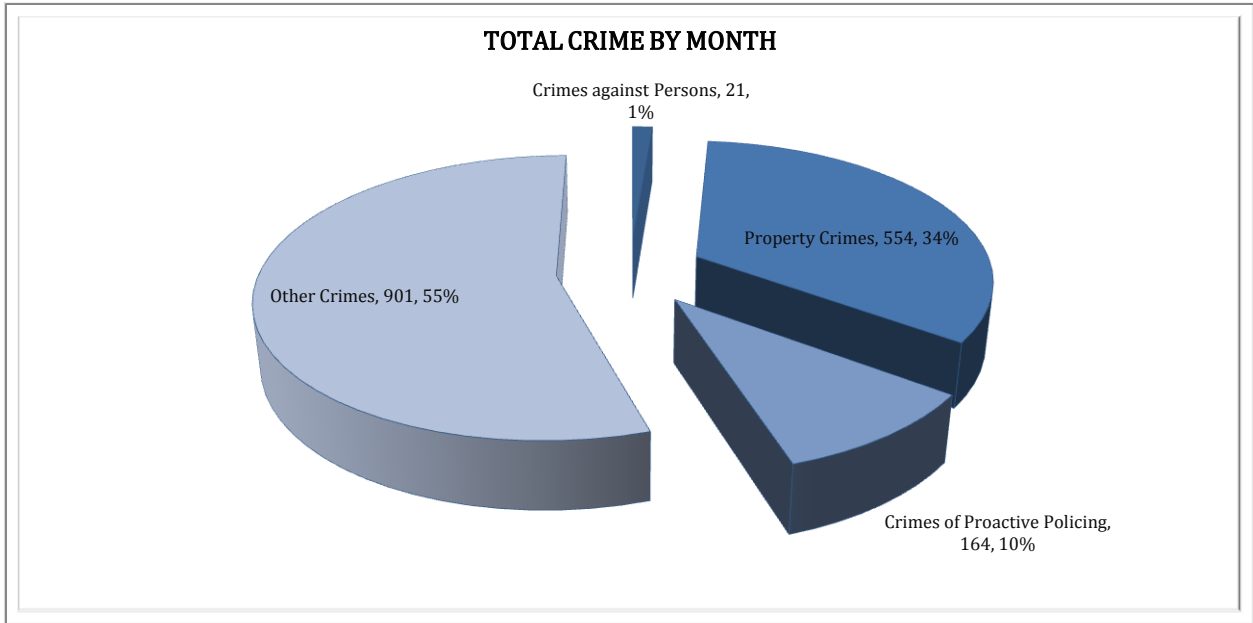
CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, and Arrest Demographics.

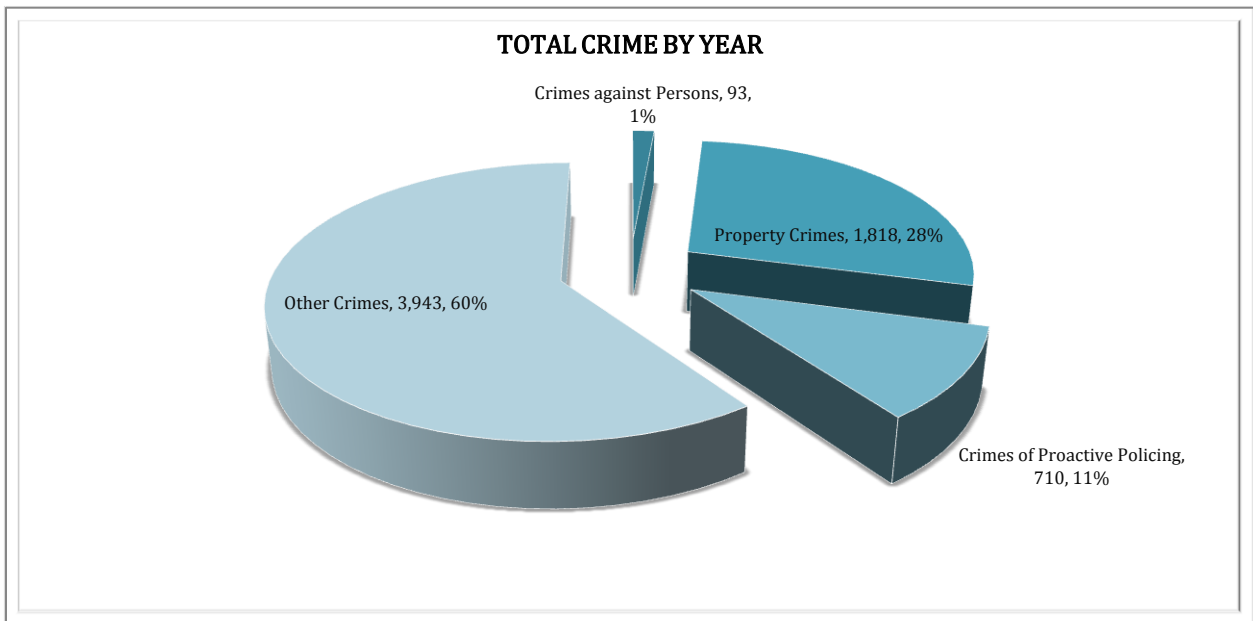
TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of April, 2011, is at a total of 1,640 offenses, up from 1,579 offenses last April, a 4% increase. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,263, the crime rate is 24.38 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of April of this year, compared to the 24.53 crimes per 1,000 population last year, a 4% increase*. Other Crimes absorb the majority, 55%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 901$). Property crimes fall in second place and are at 34% ($n = 554$). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 10% ($n = 164$) and crimes against persons at 1% ($n = 21$).

* Note: Numbers are based on 2010 population estimate = 64,374.

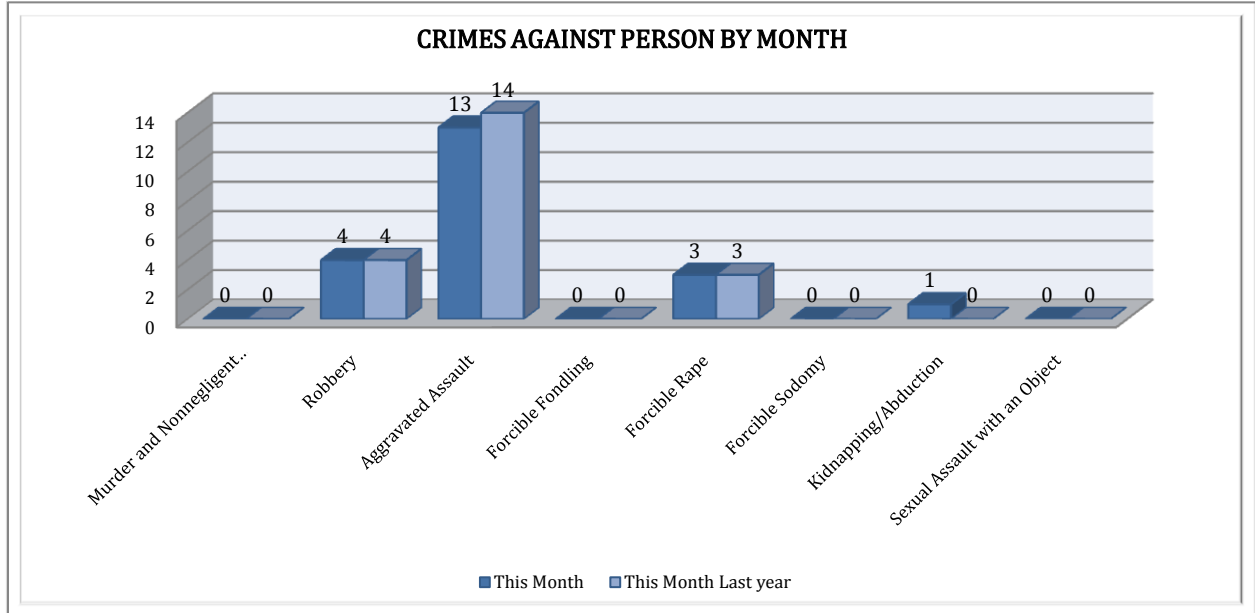


Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through April, of which there is a total of 6,564 offenses, up from 5,967 last April, a 10% increase. Again, Other Crimes have the highest percentage of total crimes and are at 60% ($n = 3,943$). Similar to this month's data, Property Crimes take second place at 28% ($n = 1,818$). Following are the crimes of Proactive Policing at 11% ($n = 710$) and crimes against persons at 1% ($n = 93$).

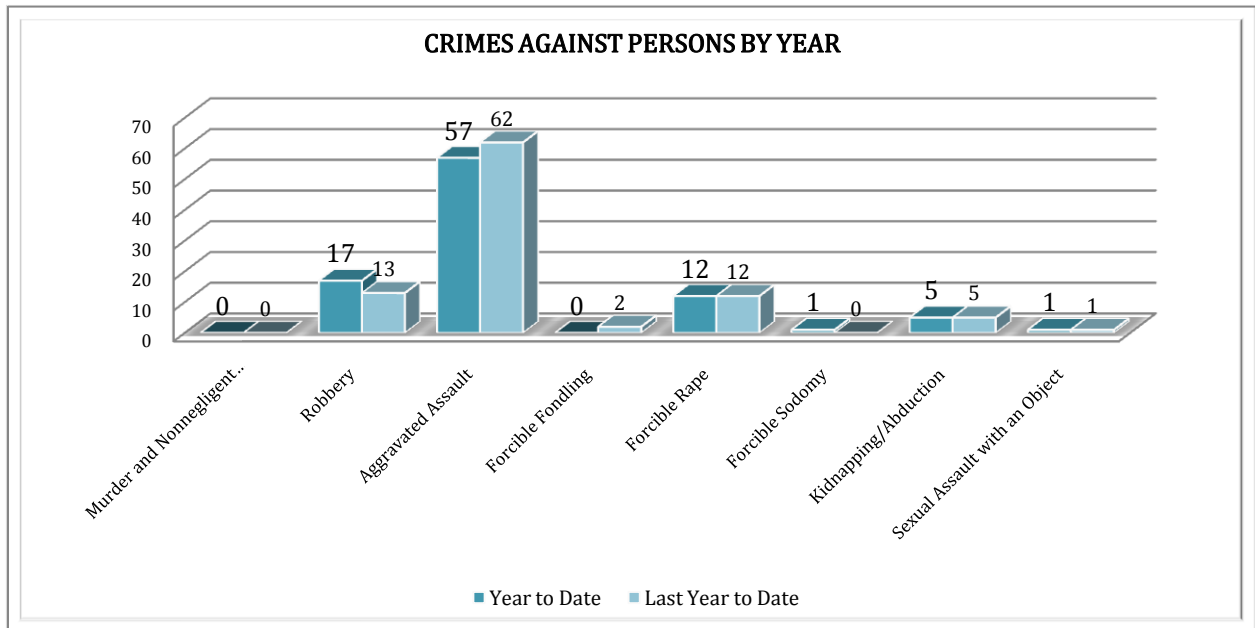


CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 8 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 21 offenses in this area this month, no overall change from last year. The following chart demonstrates this month's activity compared to April of last year's activity, where no significant differences were noted.

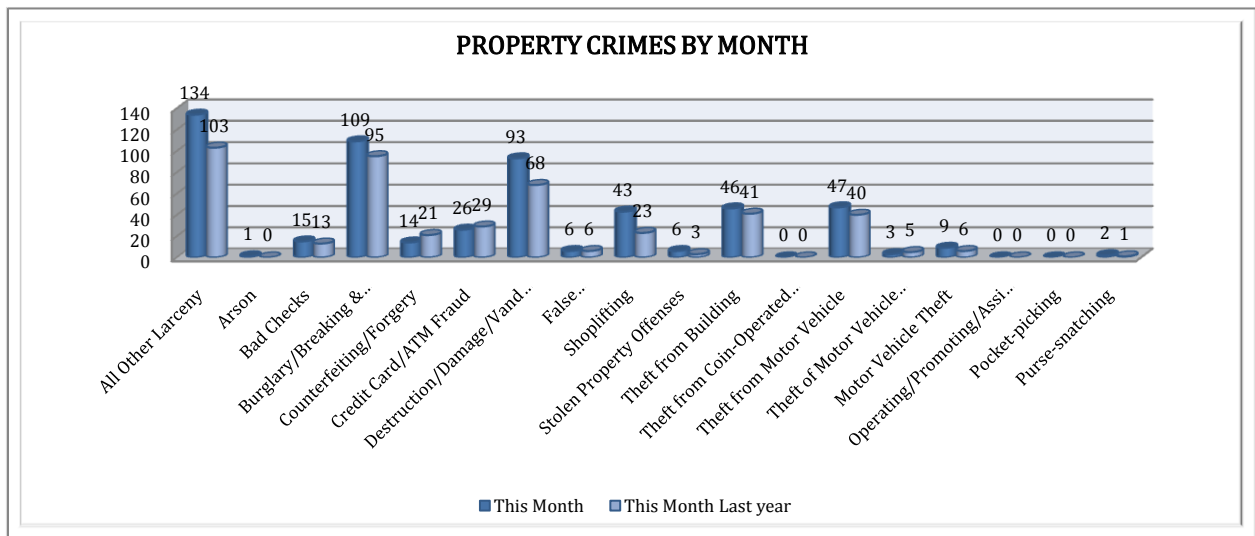


Bellows bar graph indicates the year to date data for Crimes against Persons. Total number of year to date Crimes against Persons this year is 93, down from 95 of last April, a 2% decrease. As for the year to date total, Aggravated Assaults are down by 8% but Robberies are up by 31%.

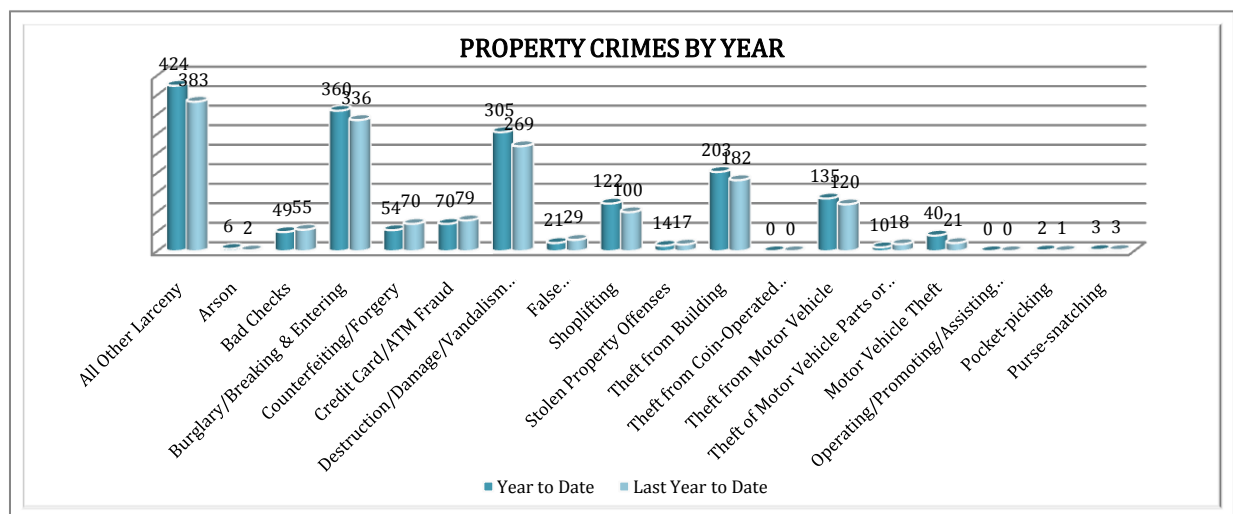


PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 554 Property Crimes, a 22% increase from last April. The data indicates a drop of Counterfeiting/Forgery crimes, a 33% decrease, compared to April 2010. All Other Larceny is significantly higher, a 30% increase from last April. Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property is also on the rise this month, a 37% increase from the April of 2010. In addition, there is an increase in Shoplifting (up 87%), Burglary (up 15%), and Theft from Motor Vehicle (18% up).

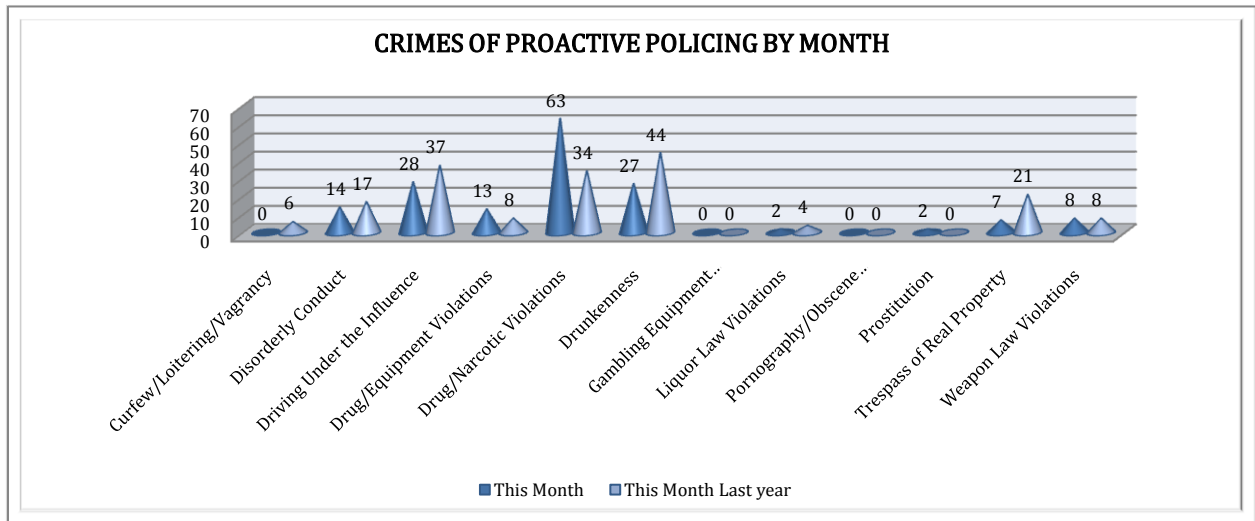


To date this year, 1,818 property offenses have occurred; the data indicates an 8% increase in change when compared to last year's data at this same time. The Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories category of crime indicates a 44% drop from last year. The Motor Vehicle Theft shows 90% increase when compared to last year. The category of Shoplifting has increased by 22%.

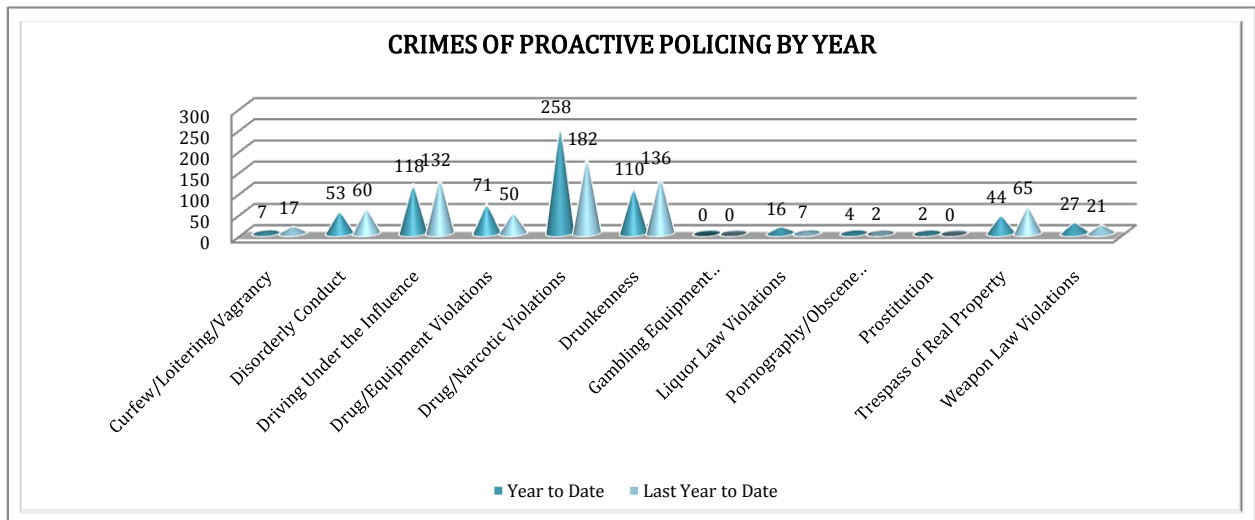


CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 164 offenses have occurred this month, an 8% decrease comparing to last April ($n = 179$). As Drug/Narcotic and Drug Equipment Violations are significantly higher, 85% and 63% increase, respectively, the decrease is evident for Drunkenness (39% down), Trespass of Real Property (67% down), and Driving Under the Influence (24% down).

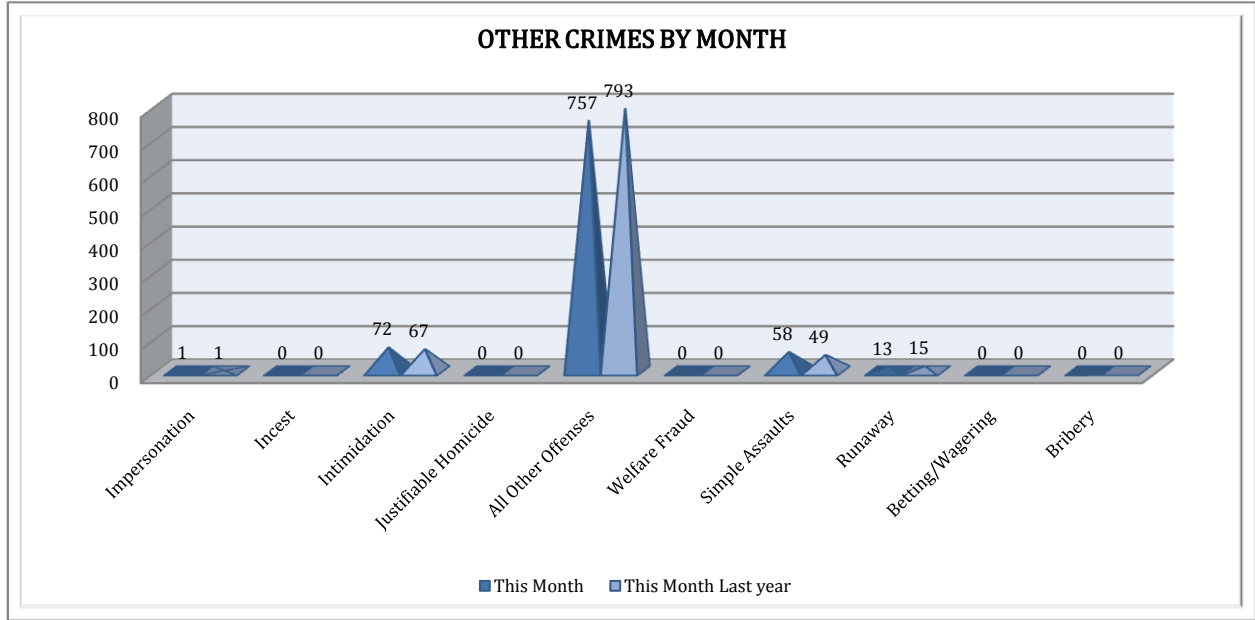


To date for the year 2011, there have been 710 crimes of proactive policing, up 6%. Again, Drug/Narcotic and Drug Equipment Violations indicate a significant increase within this crime category as they both are up by 42%. Weapon Law Violations are up by 29%. We see an evident drop in Driving under the Influence (11% down).

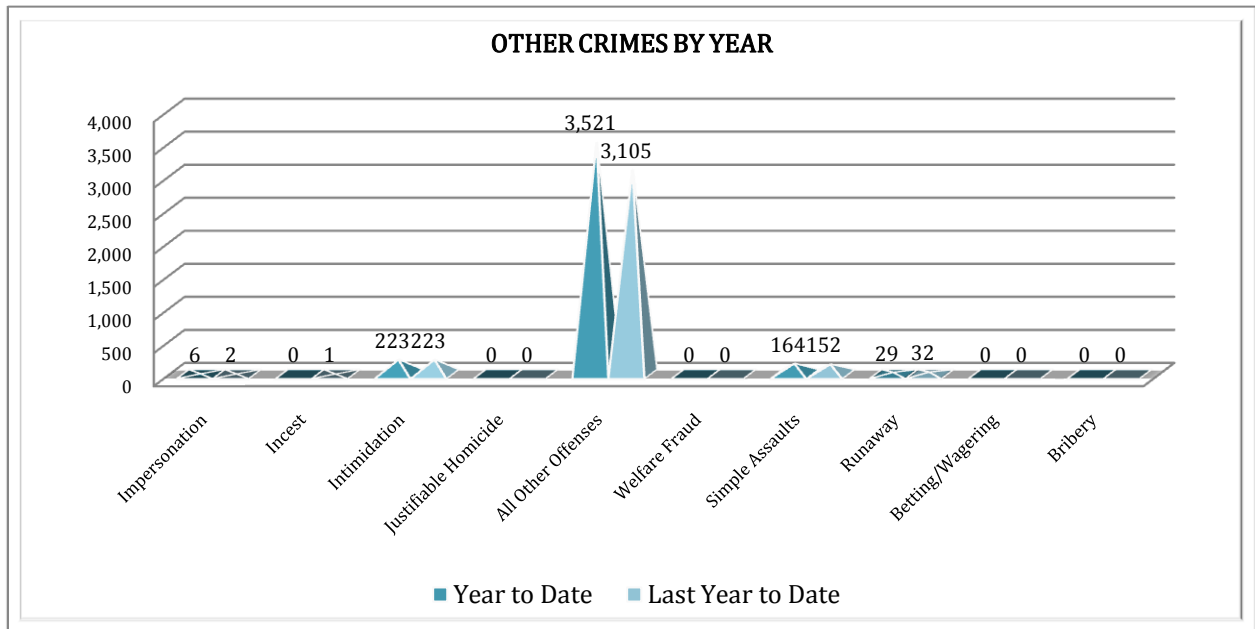


OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 901 Other Crimes, down from 925 last April, a 3% decrease. Simple Assaults are up, an 18% increase and so are Intimidations, indicating a 7% increase. All Other Crimes are down by 5%.



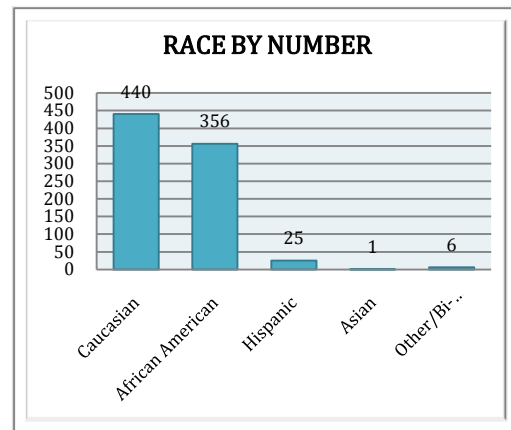
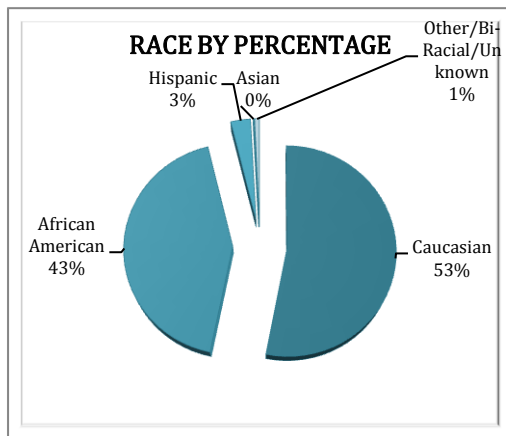
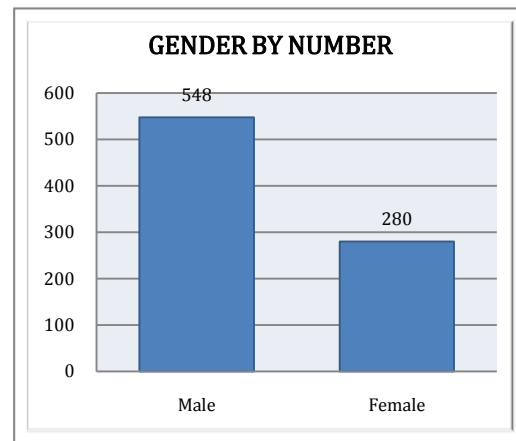
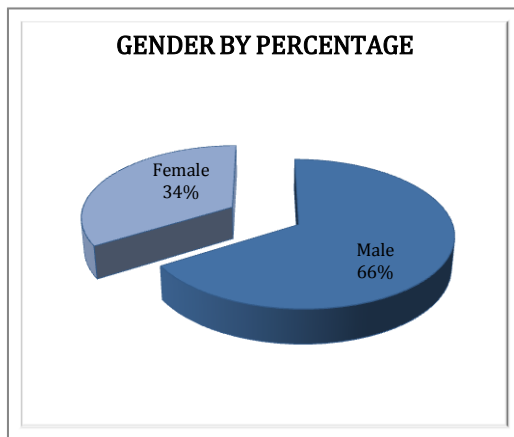
To date this year, there have been 3,943 Other Crimes, up from 3,515 last April, a 12% increase. Simple Assaults are slightly up, an 8% increase. All Other Crimes within the Other Crimes category are up 13%, compared to last year's totals.



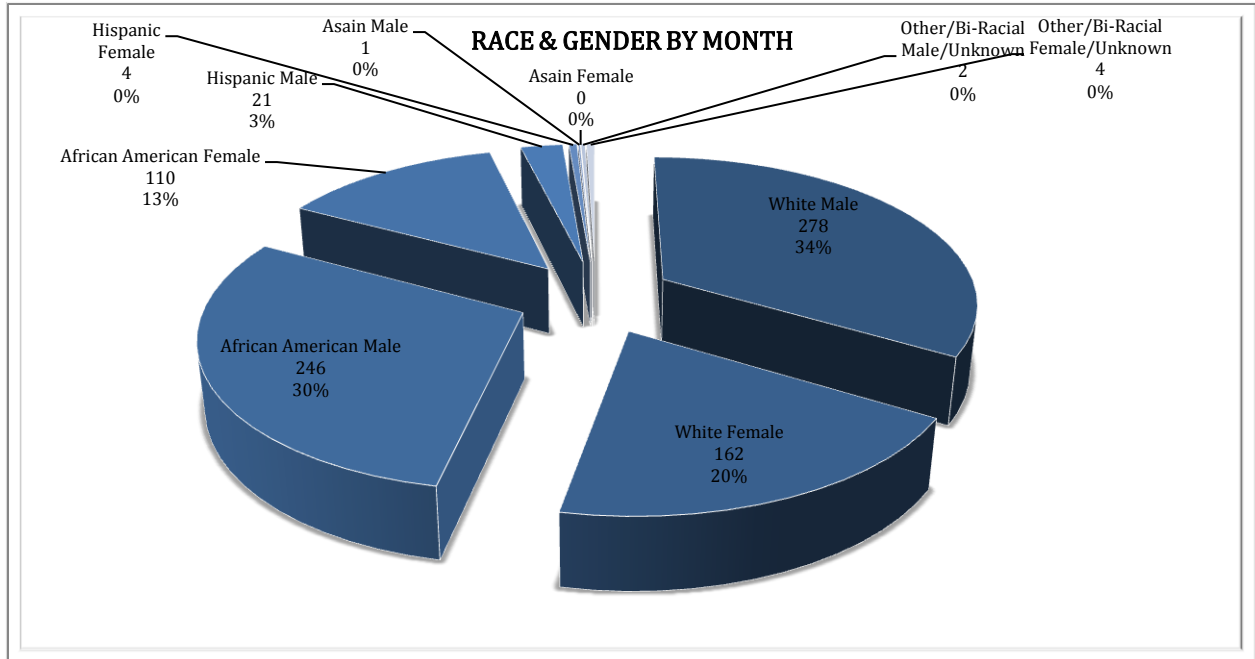
ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In March, there were a total of 828 arrests, as opposed to 807 arrests in April of last year, a 3% increase; that is 0.51 arrests per crime for April of this year, indicating no change in arrests rate from last year.

This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male ($n = 540$), as opposed to female ($n = 280$) and Caucasian ($n = 440$) and African American ($n = 356$) as opposed to Hispanic ($n = 25$), Asian ($n = 1$), or other/unknown/bi-racial ($n = 6$).



Caucasian males make up the majority of offenders for the month of April, totaling 34% ($n = 278$). African American males account for 30% ($n = 246$) of the male offenders this month. Caucasian females make up 20% ($n = 162$) and African American females make up 13% ($n = 110$). Hispanic males make up 3% ($n = 21$). There were 4 Hispanic Females arrested and 1 Asian male. There were 2 Other/Biracial Males and 4 Other/Biracial Female arrestees in April. This distribution can be reviewed in the pie chart below.

EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL

The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

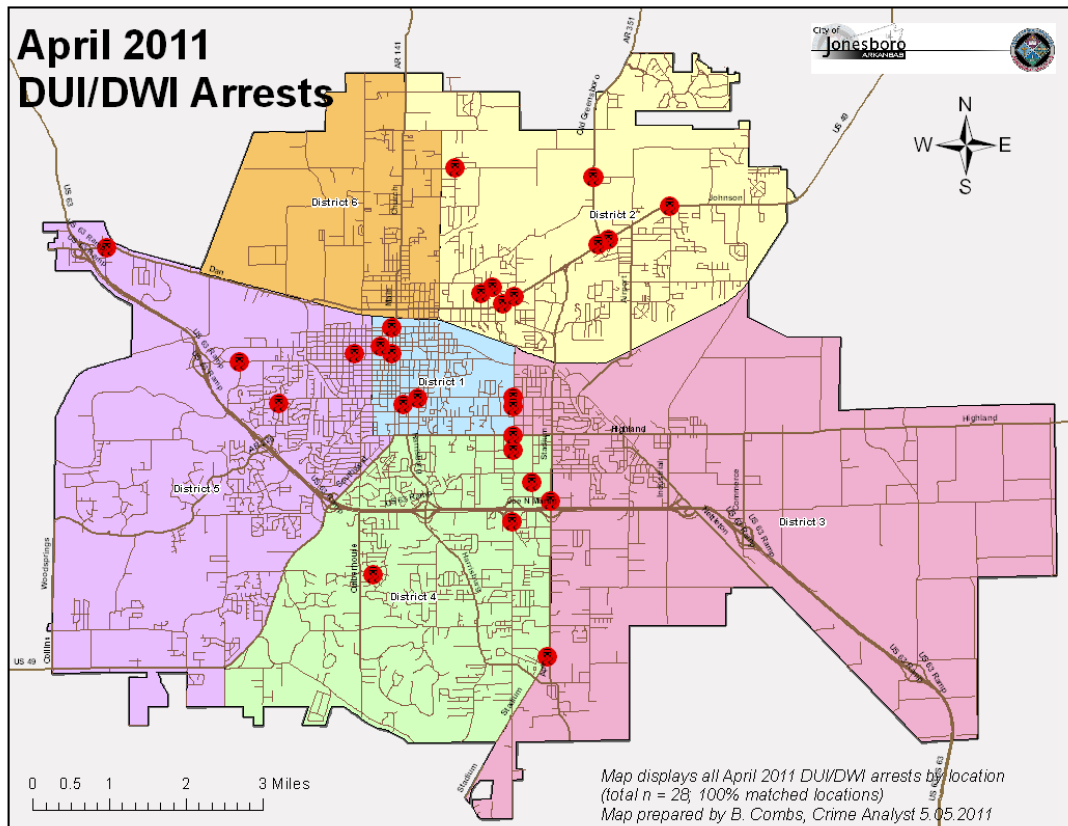
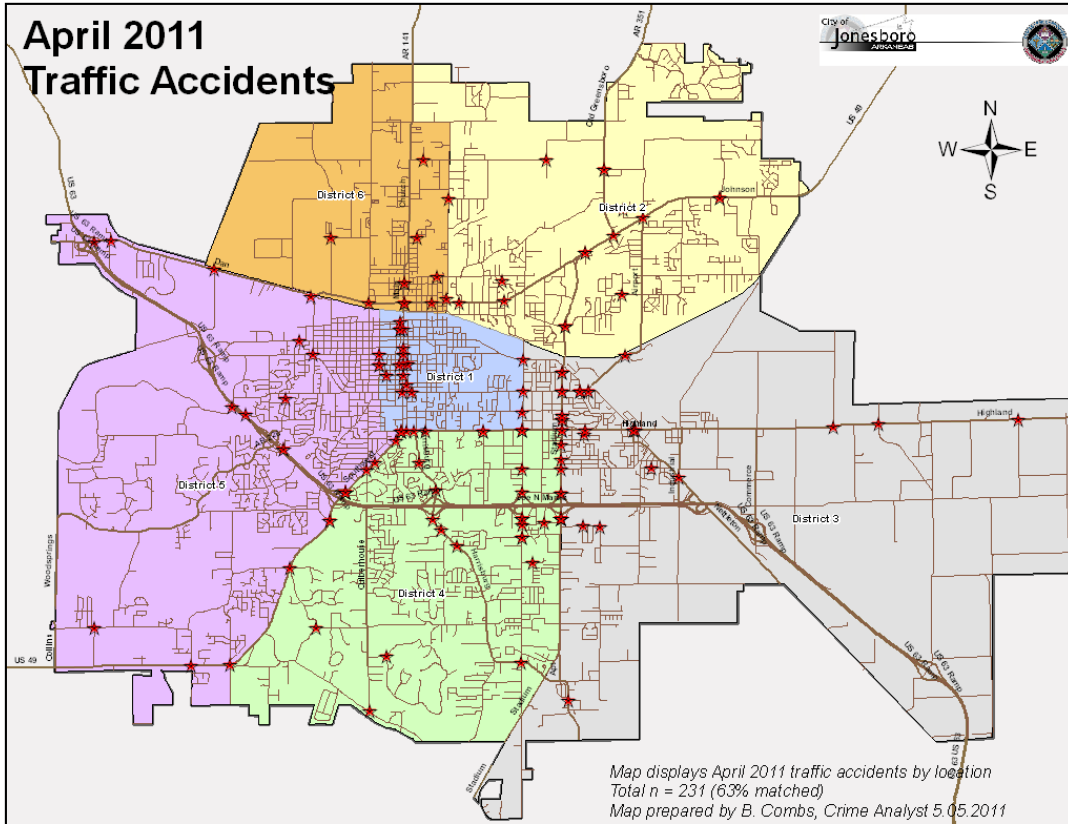
TRAFFIC
