

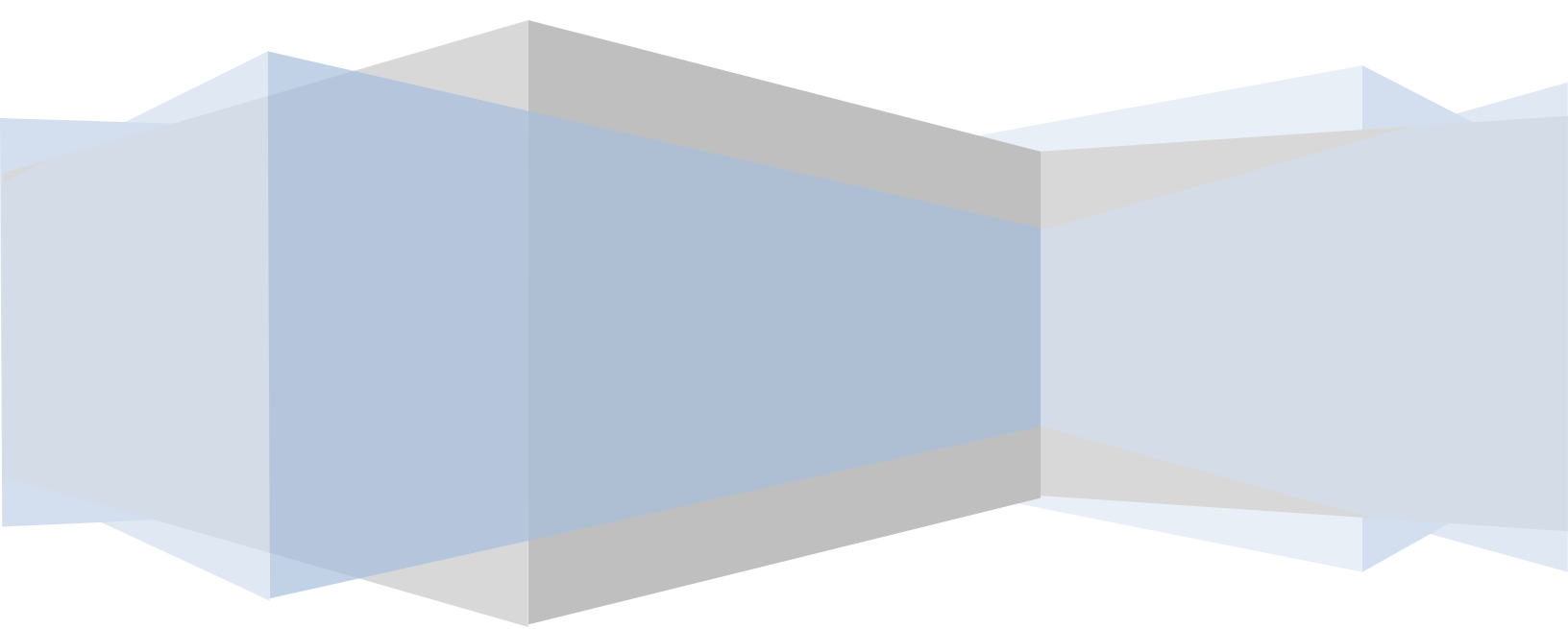

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

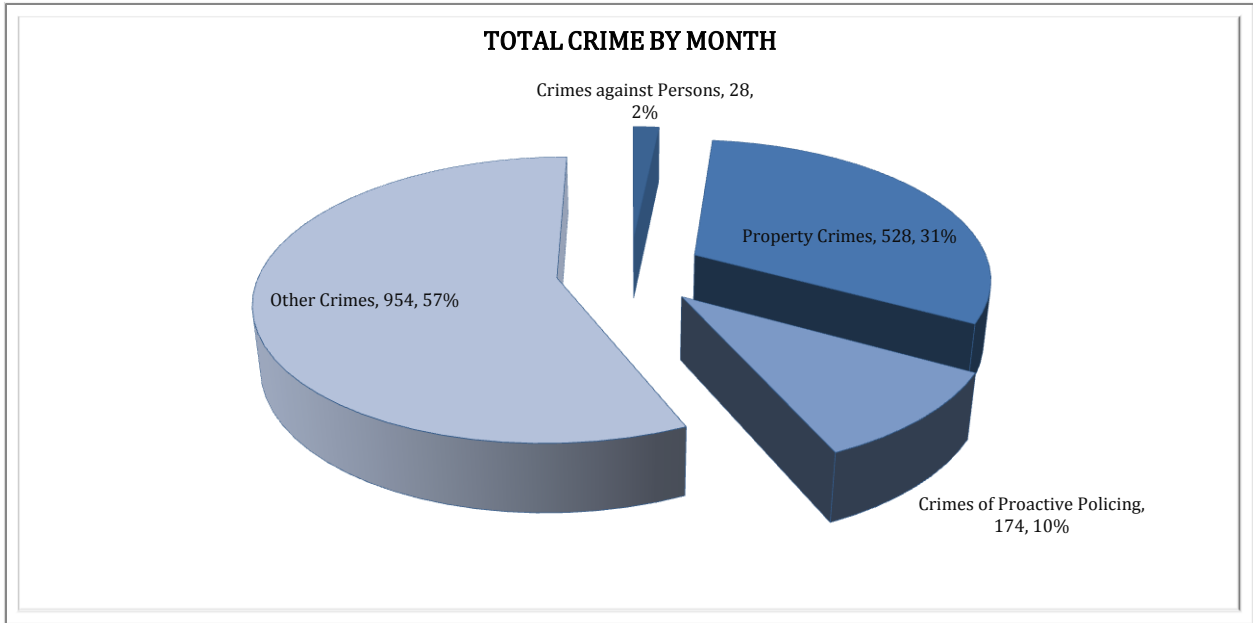
CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, and Arrest Demographics.

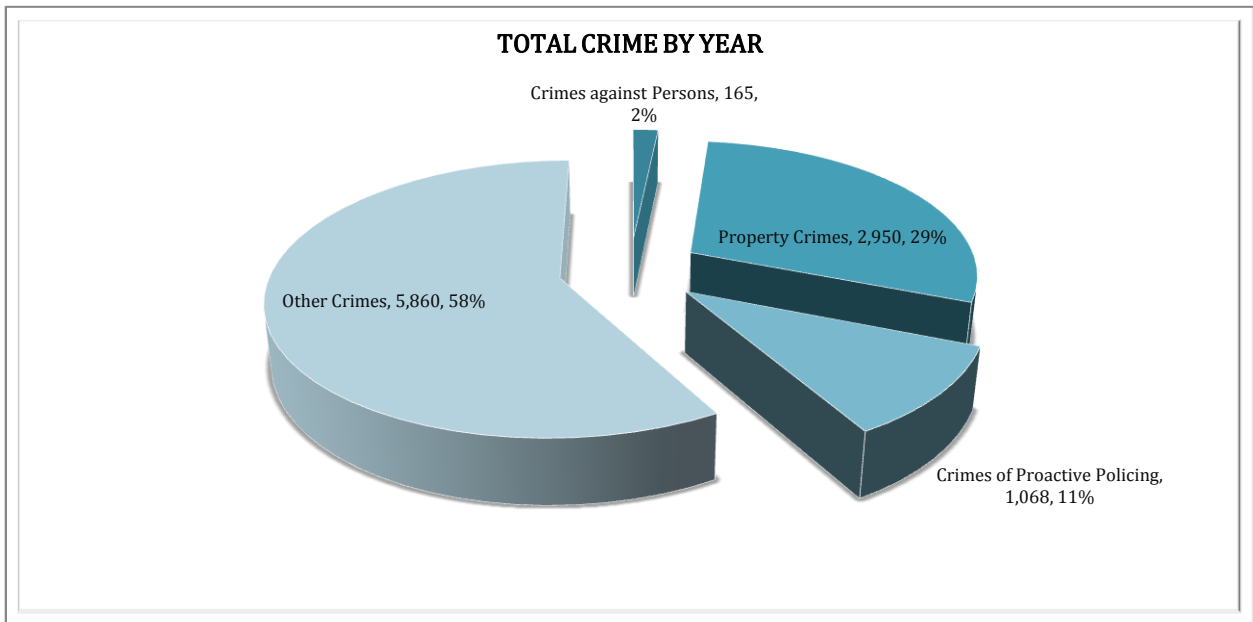
TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of June, 2011, is at a total of 1,684 offenses, up from 1,621 offenses in last June, a 4% increase. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,263, the crime rate is 25.04 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of June this year, compared to the 25.18 crimes per 1,000 population last year, a 1% drop*. As indicated on a pie chart on the following page, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 57%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 954$). Property crimes fall in second place and are at 31% ($n = 528$). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 10% ($n = 174$) and crimes against persons at 2% ($n = 28$).

* Note: 2010 numbers are based on 2010 population estimate, $n = 64,374$.

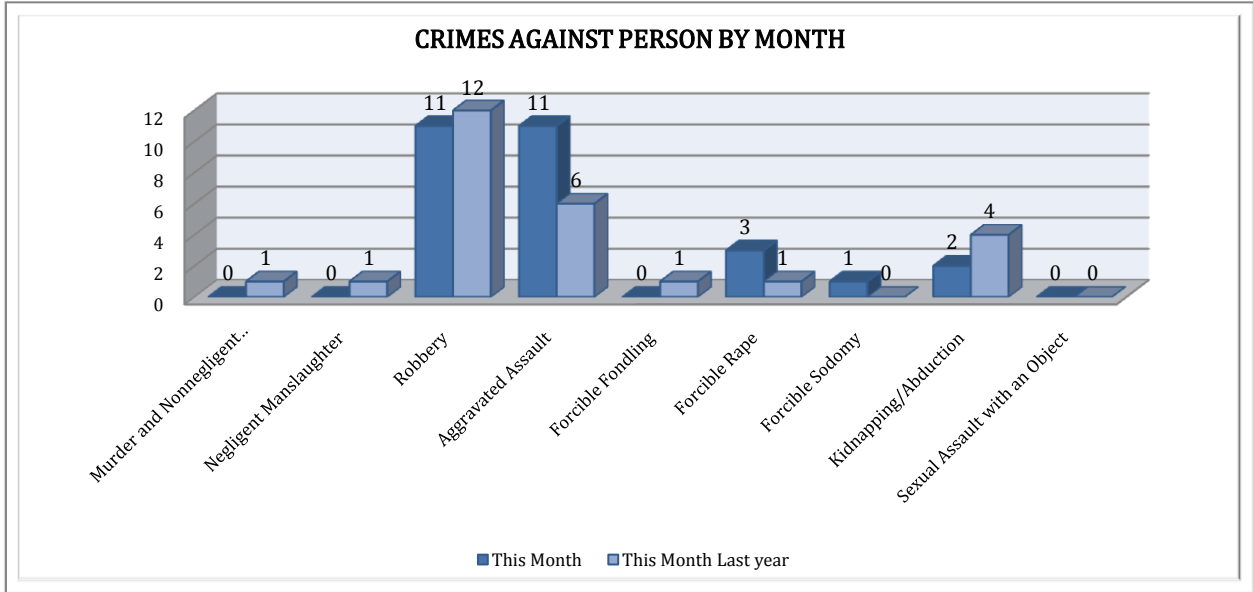


Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through June, of which there is a total of 10,043 offenses, up from 9,313 offenses that occurred through June last year, an 8% increase or 3% increase in crime rate per 1,000 population. Again, Other Crimes have the highest percentage of total crimes and are at 58% ($n = 5,860$). Similar to this month's data, Property Crimes take second place at 29% ($n = 2,950$). Following are the crimes of Proactive Policing at 11% ($n = 1,068$) and crimes against persons at 2% ($n = 165$).



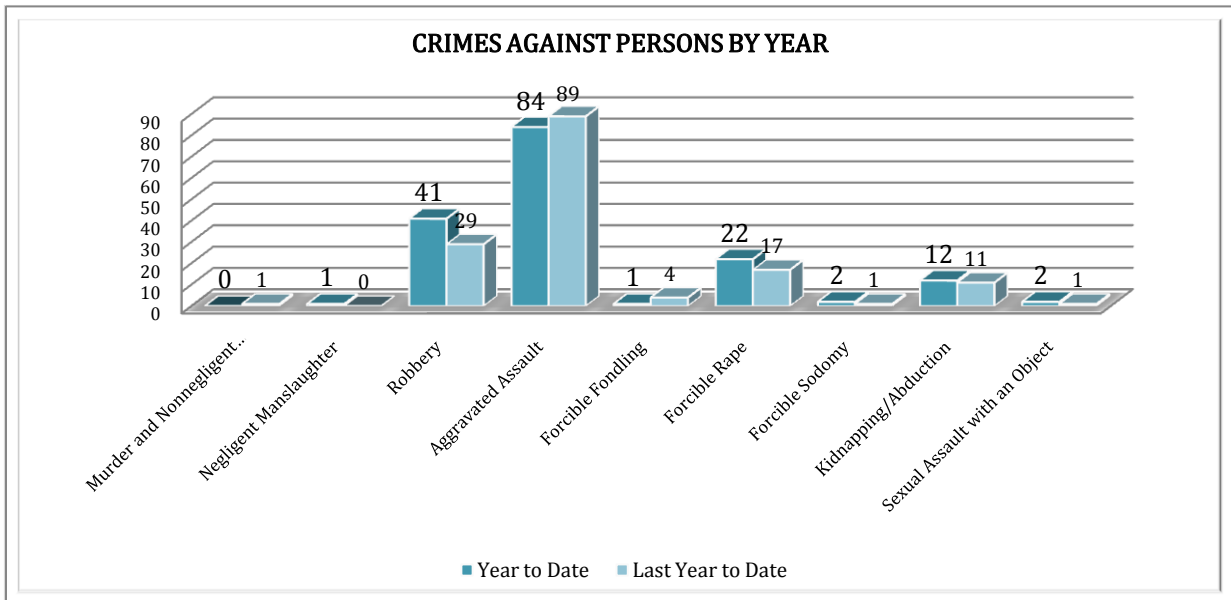
CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 28 offenses in this area this month, an 8% increase from the last year's data. As demonstrated on the following chart, Aggravated Assault is higher by 83% this month compared to June of last year. There are no significant changes in other crimes for this category.



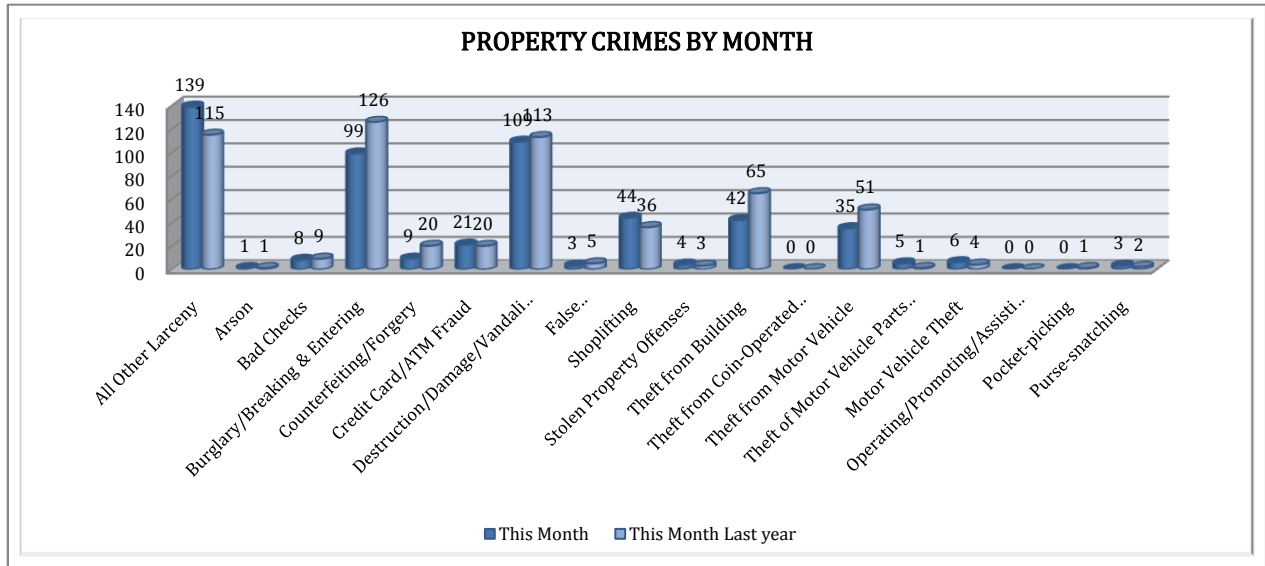
**The Murder & Non-negligent Manslaughter shown in the previous month's report on page 4 under Crimes against Person section, was an attempted murder and thus, this record is being removed from this report.*

Bellows bar graph shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons. Total number of year to date Crimes against Persons this year is 165, up 8% from June last year. As for the year to date total, Aggravated Assaults are slightly down, a 6% decrease. Robberies are up by 41% and Forcible Rape increased by 29% to date this year.

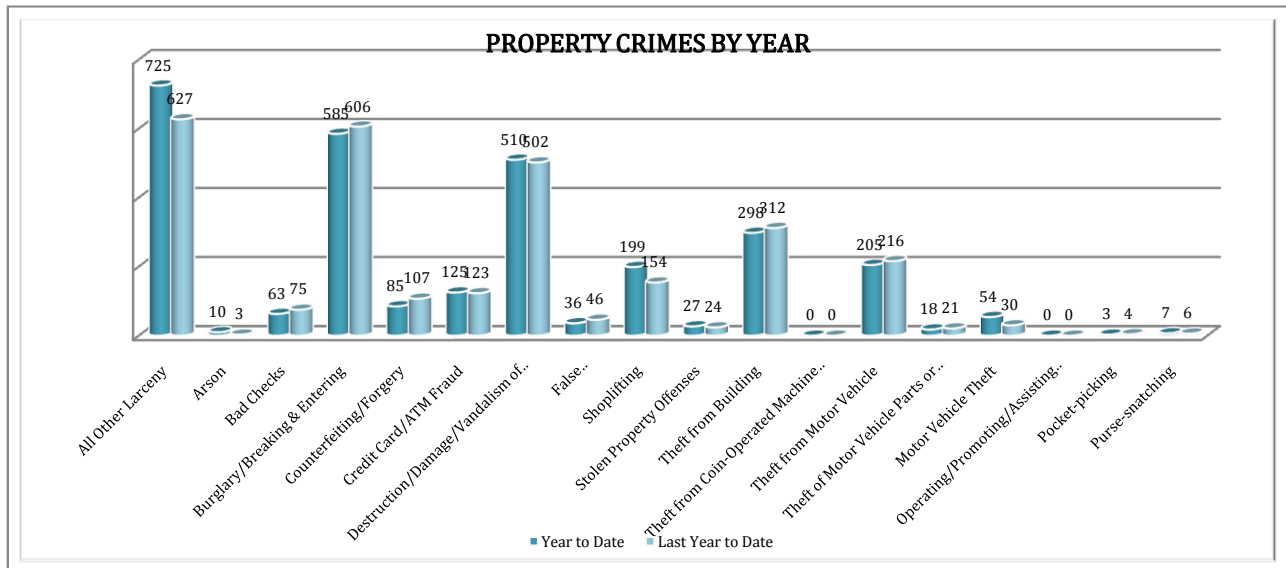


PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 528 Property Crimes, an 8% decrease comparing to June of last year. The data indicates a 55% drop in Counterfeiting/Forgery, compared to June of 2010. In addition, Theft from Building is down by 35%, Burglary/Breaking and Entering crimes are down 21%, and Theft from Motor Vehicle shows a 31% decrease. All Other Larceny is at 21% increase comparing to June of last year.

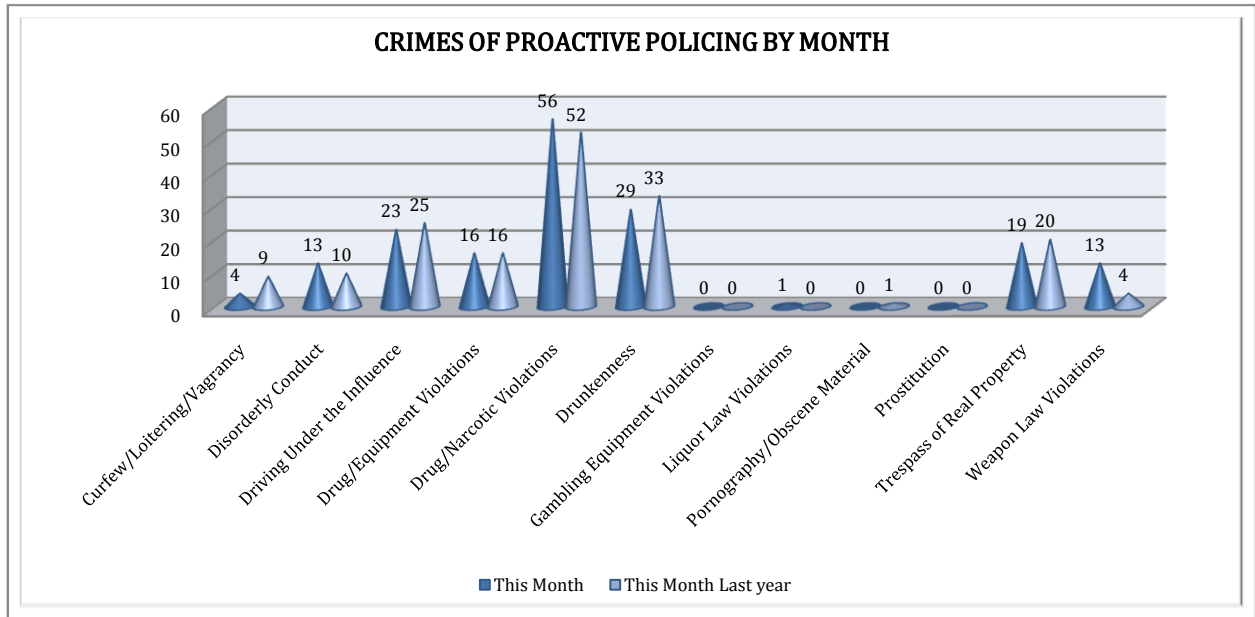


To date this year, 2,950 property offenses have occurred; the data indicates a 3% increase in change when compared to last year's data at this same time. Comparing to the numbers of last year, there is a noticeable 21% drop in Counterfeiting/Forgery offenses and 3% drop in Burglary/Breaking & Entering. The Motor Vehicle Theft is also down to date this year. The category of Shoplifting has increased by 29%.

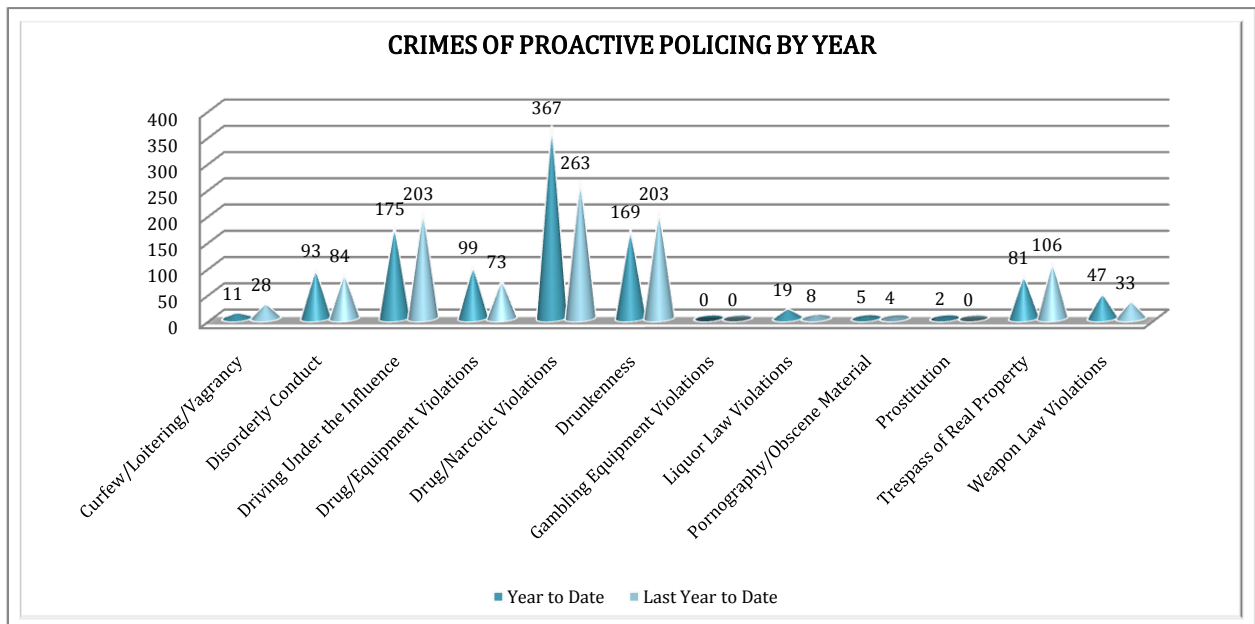


CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 174 offenses have occurred this month, a 2% increase comparing to June last year. Although based on low numbers, there is a noticeable 225% increase in percentage change for Weapon Law Violations.

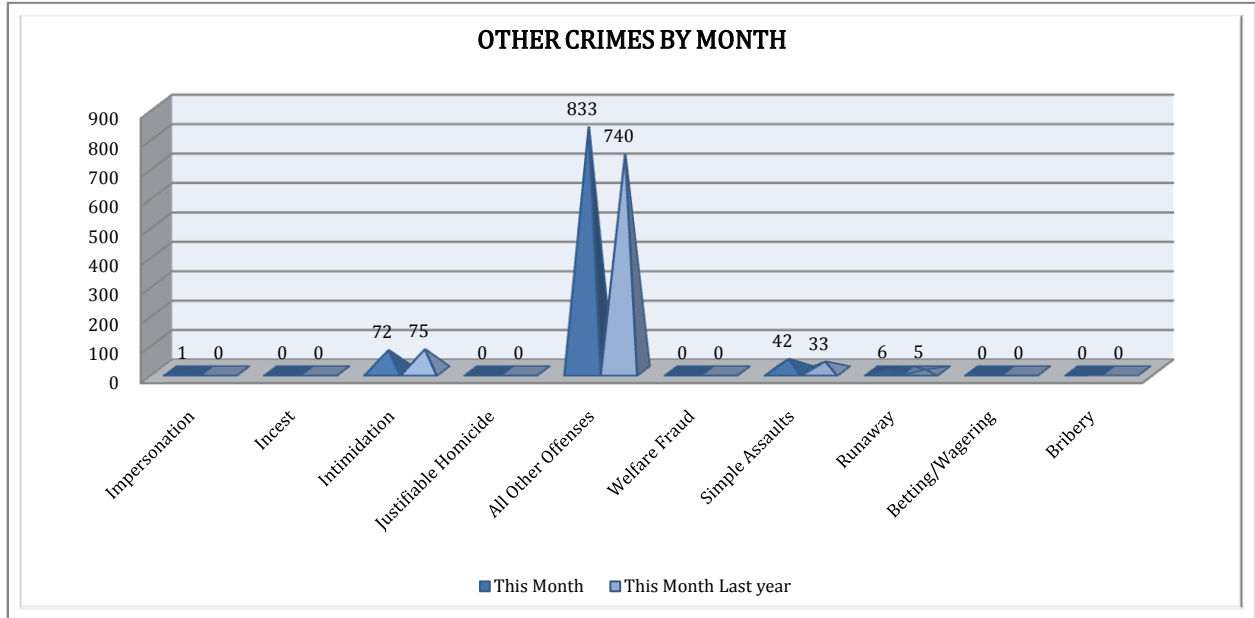


To date for the year 2011, there have been 1068 crimes of proactive policing, up 6% from June last year. Weapon Law Violations are up 42%. We are seeing an evident drop in Trespass of Real Property (24% down).

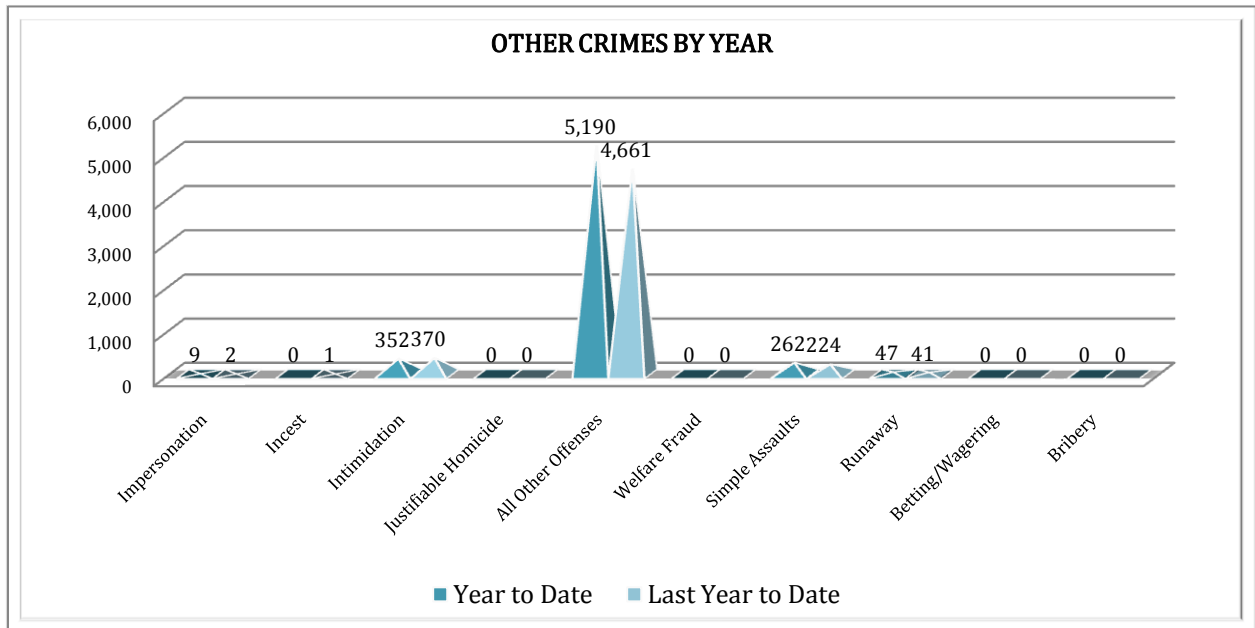


OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 954 Other Crimes, up from 853 in last June, a 12% increase. Simple Assaults are up, a 27% increase and All Other Offenses within Other Crimes categories are up 13%.



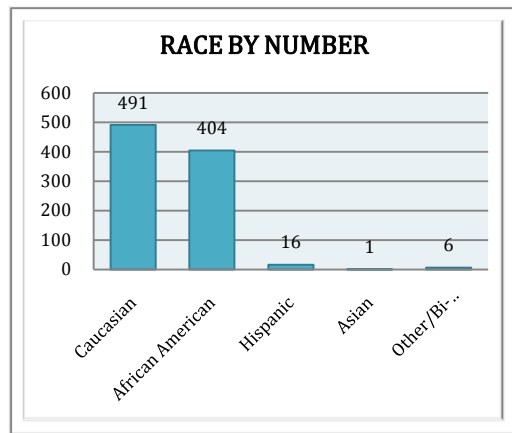
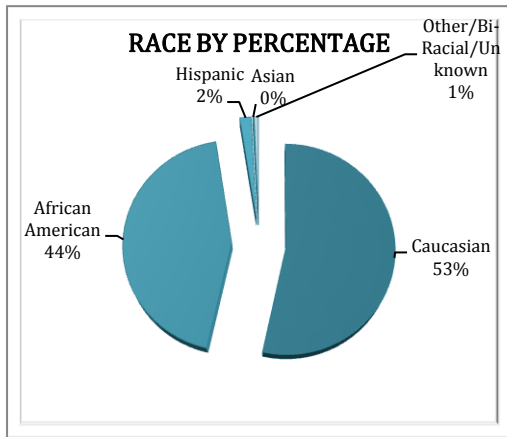
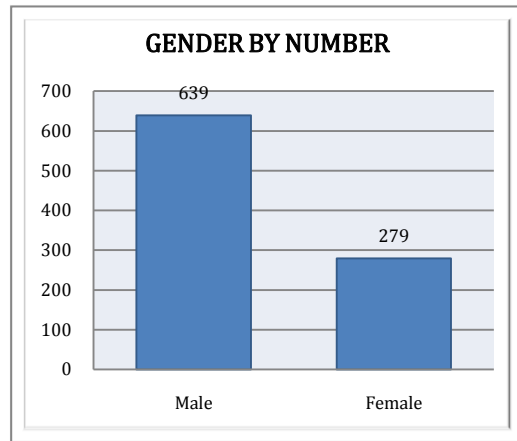
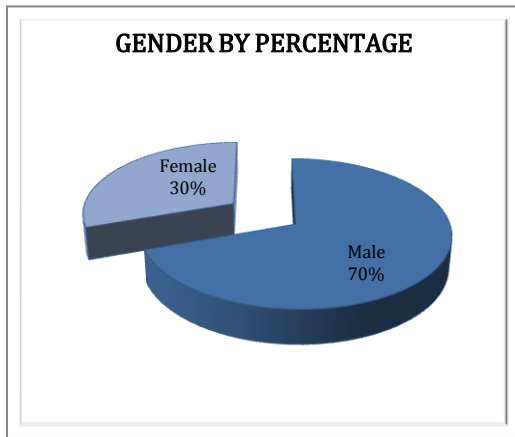
To date this year, there have been 5,860 Other Crimes, up from 5,299 of the last June, an 11% increase. Simple Assaults are up, a 17% increase; Runaways indicate 15% increase and All Other Offenses within the Other Crimes category are up 11% to date this year.



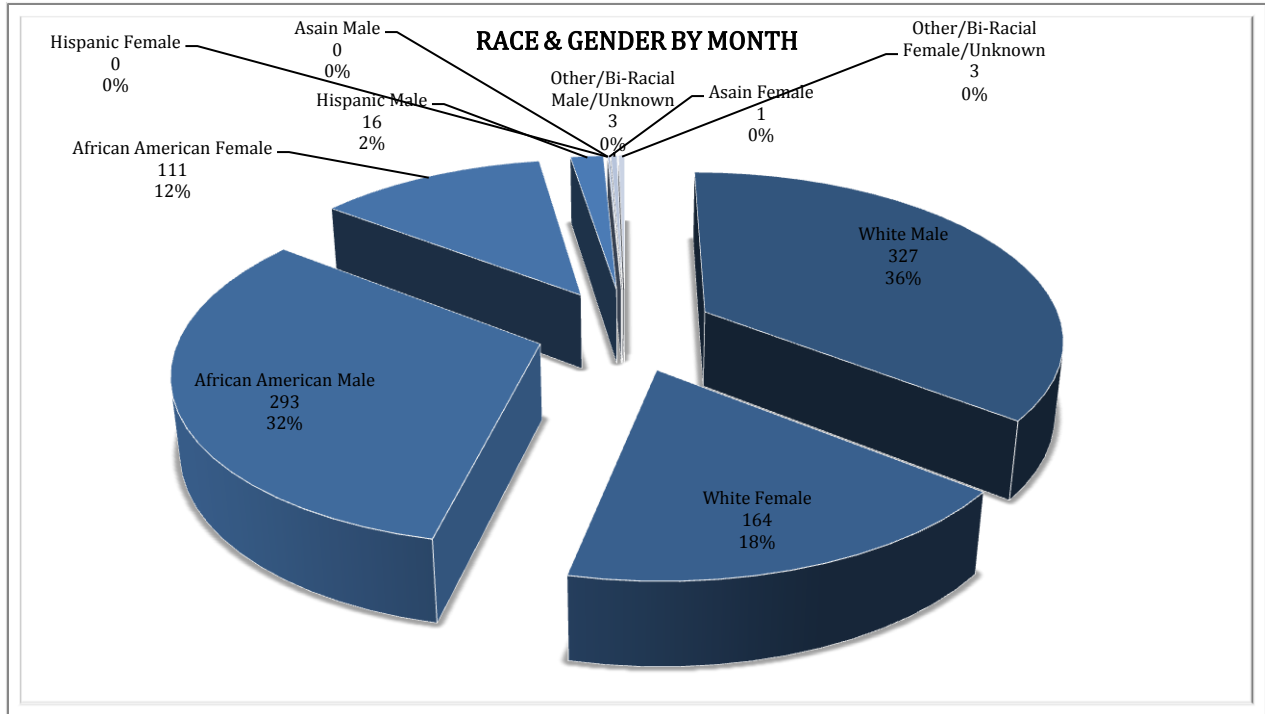
ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In June, there were a total of 918 arrests, as opposed to 842 arrests in June last year, a 5% increase; that is .55 arrests per crime in June of this year, comparing to .52 arrests per crime last year.

This section breaks down this month’s arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male ($n = 639$), as opposed to female ($n = 279$) and Caucasian ($n = 491$) and African American ($n = 404$) as opposed to Hispanic ($n = 16$), Asian ($n = 1$), or other/unknown/bi-racial ($n = 6$).



Caucasian males make up the majority, 36%, of arrestees this month ($n = 327$). African American males make up 32% of arrestees for the month of June ($n = 293$). Caucasian females make up 18% ($n = 164$) and African American females make up 12% ($n = 111$). Hispanic males make up 2% ($n = 16$). There were also 3 Other/Biracial Males and 1 Asian and 3 Other/Biracial females arrested in the month of June. This distribution can be reviewed in the pie chart on the following page.

EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

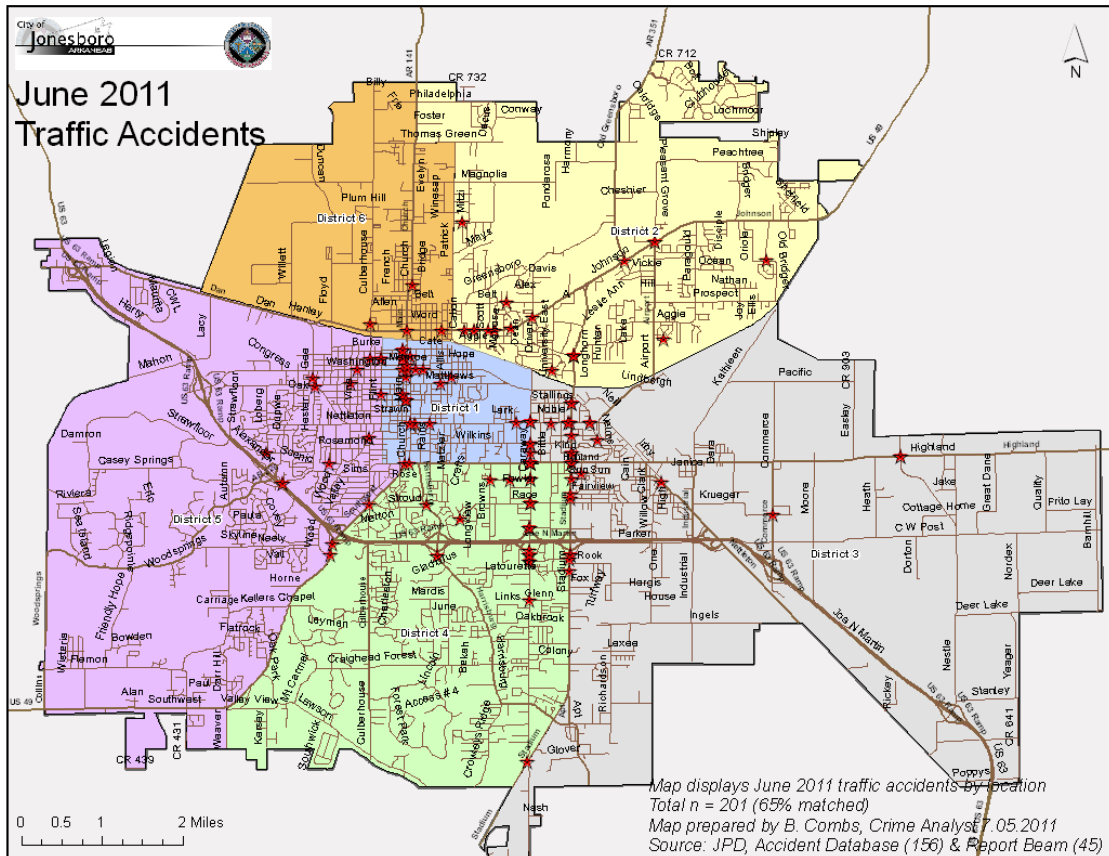

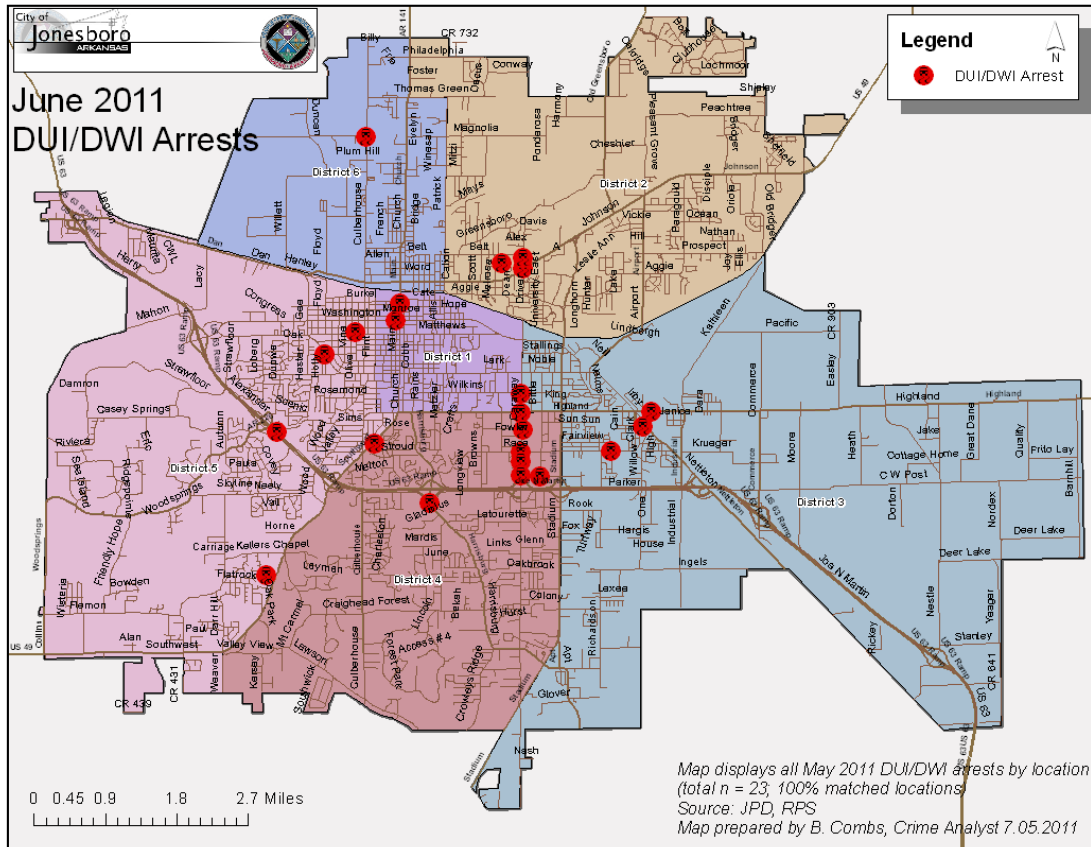
TRAFFIC
