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
PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Crime in Jonesboro has decreased overall, down 8% from this month last year. Total Crime month over month has decreased, from 1391 crimes in August 2014 to 1242 crimes in August 2018. August Crimes Against Persons have increased from this month last year to this year, up 12 incidents, or 52%. Property Crimes has increased from this month from last year, up 19 incidents, or a 4% increase. Crimes of Proactive Policing are up this month by 33 incidents or 13%. Other Crimes has shown a decrease this month of 9%; down 24 incidents.




CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis Unit consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the City of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the Jonesboro Police Department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing; by administration for improved staffing decisions; and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into: Total Crime, Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.


TOTAL CRIME


The crime activity for the month of August 2018 was at a total of 1,242 NIBRS reportable offenses, there was a 2% increase compared to the total number of offenses reported in August of last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in August of this year was at 17 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 17 crimes per 1,000 population last year. As indicated on the pie chart below, Property Crimes absorb the majority, 43%, of this month's crime activity (n = 531), Other Crimes comprise of 31% of crimes (n = 393), Crimes of Proactive Policing is comprised of 23% (n = 283) of all reported crimes, and Crimes Against Persons is comprised of 3% (n = 35) of all reported crimes this month.


The charts below depict the frequencies of crimes in the month of August from year to year, frequencies of crime by year, and a year to date annual comparison.






CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 8 NIBRS offenses that make up this section. A total of 35 offenses have been reported this month, up 10% compared to August of last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, the most significant change was Kidnaping/Abduction, which is up 300% (up 3 incident) this month. Aggravated Assault is up 53% (up 9 incident) this month.




PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for property crimes. This month, there were a total of 531 Property Crimes, a 4% increase when compared to August of last year. Shoplifting is up 48% (an 11 incident increase), Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories is down 75% (a 3 incident decrease), while Motor Vehicle Theft is down 50% (a 4 incident decrease). No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.




CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve offenses fall under this category. A total of 283 offenses have been reported this month, up 13% compared to August of last year. Pornography/Obscene Material are up 200% (a 6 incident increase). Driving Under the Influence are down 25% (a 6 incident decrease), and Liquor Law Violations are up 600% (a 6 incident increase). There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.




OTHER CRIMES


There are 10 offenses that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 391 Other Crimes reported, a 9% decrease compared to August of last year. Intimidation has increased by 33% (a 19 incident increase). All Other Offenses has decreased by 17% (a 60 incident decrease). No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.




ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS


In August 2018, there were a total of 499 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 69%, have been male (n=345), as opposed to 31% of female arrestees (n=154).






As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (53%) and African American (42%), compared to Hispanic (4%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%). Caucasian males make up the majority at 34% arrestees this month, followed by African American males at 30% arrestees. Caucasian females make up 19%, while African American females make up 11% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 3%, Hispanic females represent 2 arrestees, Other/Unknown race males made up of 1% arrestees, 0 of females of Other/Unknown race were arrested this month, 0 Asian males and 2 Asian females were arrested this month.







EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

The primary responsibility of CID is to conduct investigations into criminal acts reported to the Jonesboro Police Department. Investigations may encompass initial response, locating and interviewing victims and witnesses, crime scene investigation and reconstruction and evidence gathering, video and computer related evidence retrieval, general and crime specific intelligence gathering, as well as development of suspects and other activities related to the suspect arrest. The unit has members who, in addition to their daily responsibilities, also serve with a variety of state, regional and federal task forces involving financial crimes, crimes against children, internet crimes and others. The primary goal of CID is to collect, preserve and present evidence that conclusively leads to a successful arrest and prosecution. Additionally, the unit works with other department units and city entities toward the prevention of crime and other activities related to maintaining quality of life for the city residents and visitors.

In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
