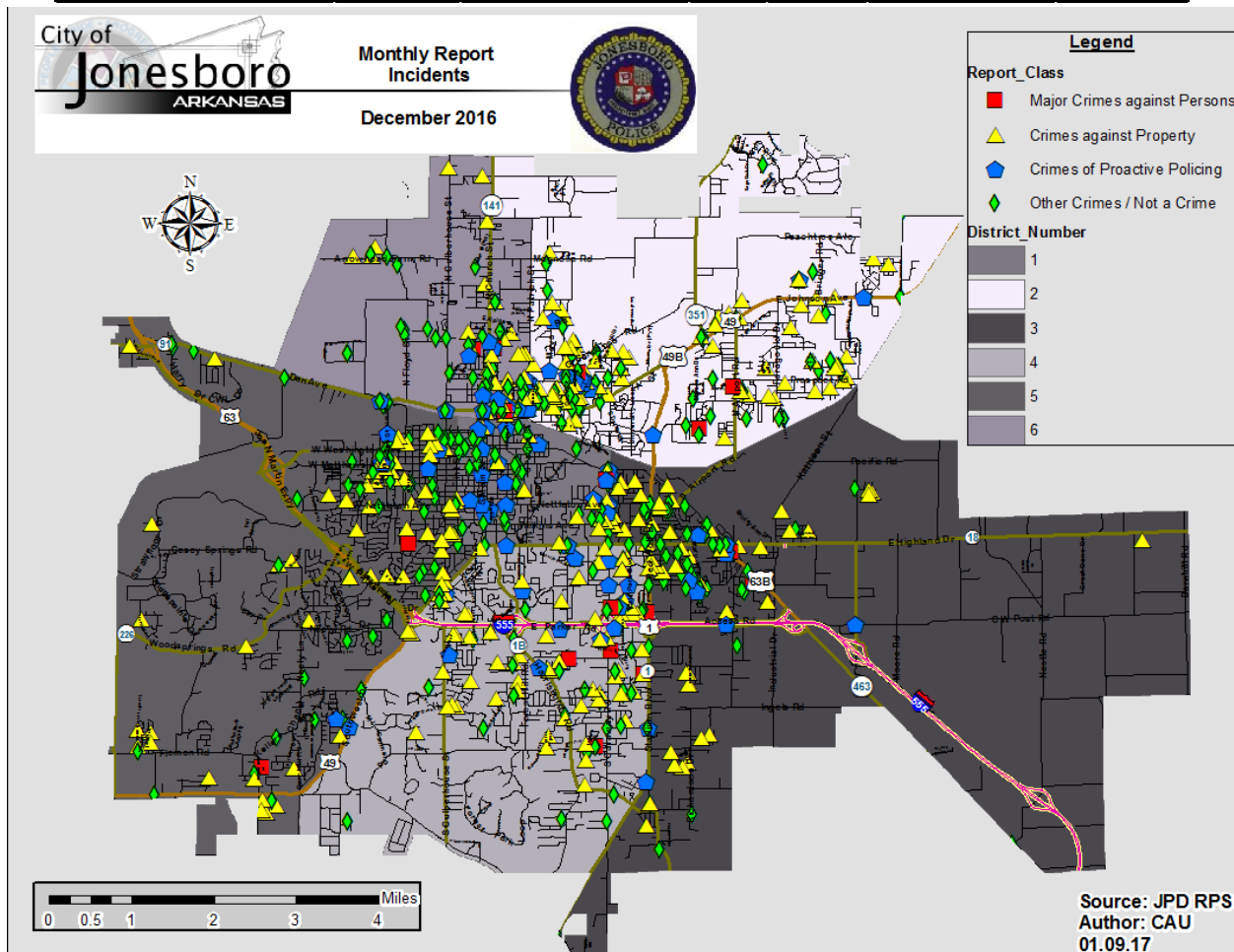
PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Crime in Jonesboro has decreased overall, down 5% from this month last year. Total Crime month over month has decreased, from 1117 crimes in December 2015 to 1360 crimes in December 2016. December Crimes Against Persons have decreased from last year to this year, down 8 incidents, or 24%. Property Crimes has increased from this month from last year, up 101 incidents, or a 22% increase. Crimes of Proactive Policing are down this month by 34 incidents or 16%. Other Crimes has shown a decrease this month of 5%; down 29 incidents.

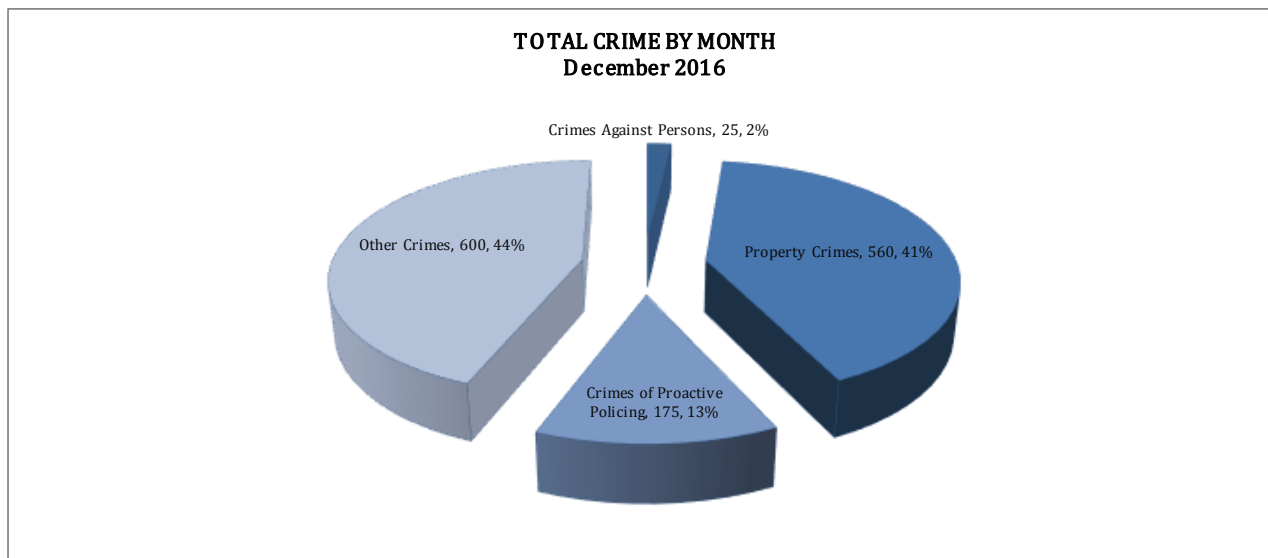


CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis Unit consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the City of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the Jonesboro Police Department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing; by administration for improved staffing decisions; and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into: Total Crime, Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

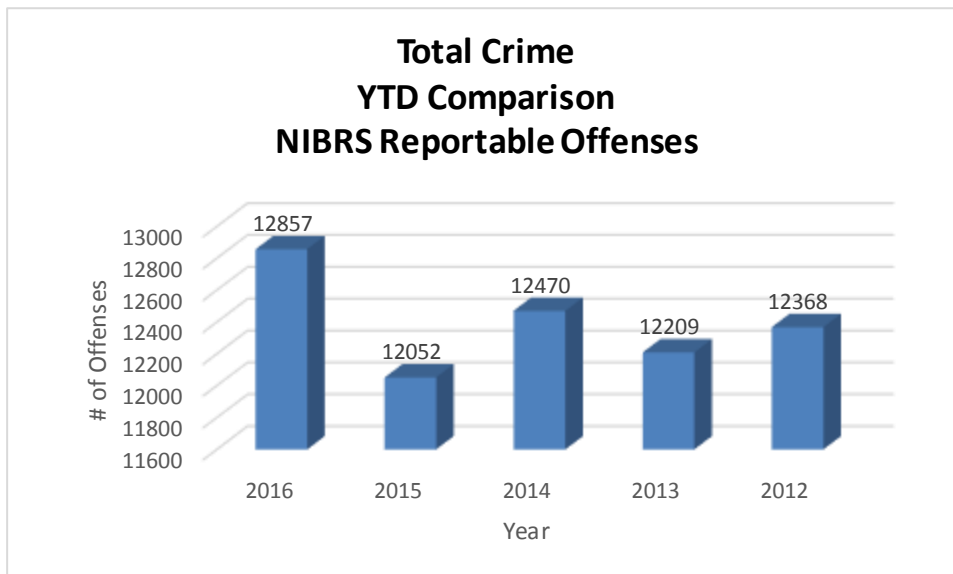
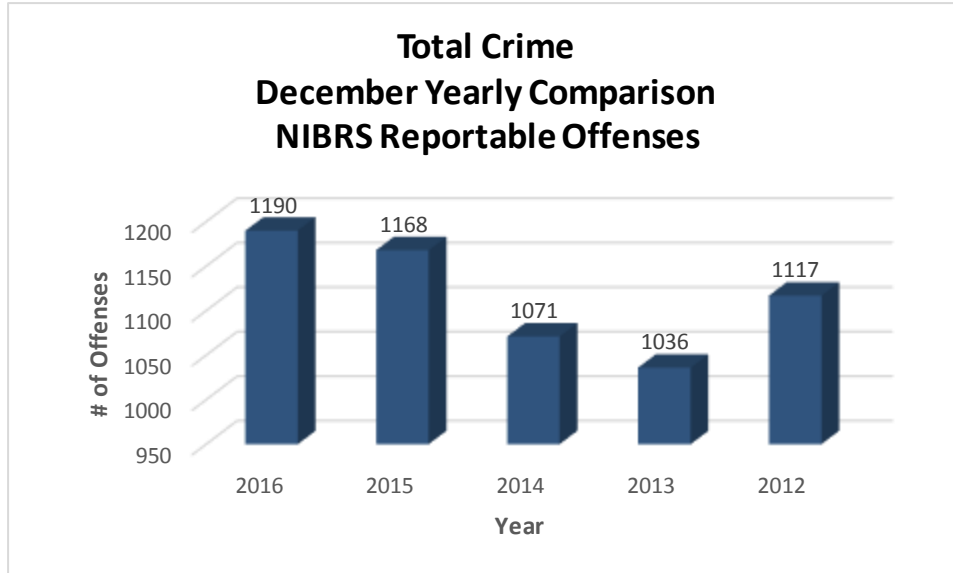
TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of December 2016 was at a total of 1,360 NIBRS reportable offenses, there was a 2% increase compared to the total number of offenses reported in December of last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in December of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 18 crimes per 1,000 population last year.¹ As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 44%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 600$), Property Crimes comprise of 41% of crimes ($n = 560$), Crimes of Proactive Policing is comprised of 13% ($n = 175$) of all reported crimes, and Crimes Against Persons is comprised of 2% ($n = 25$) of all reported crimes this month.



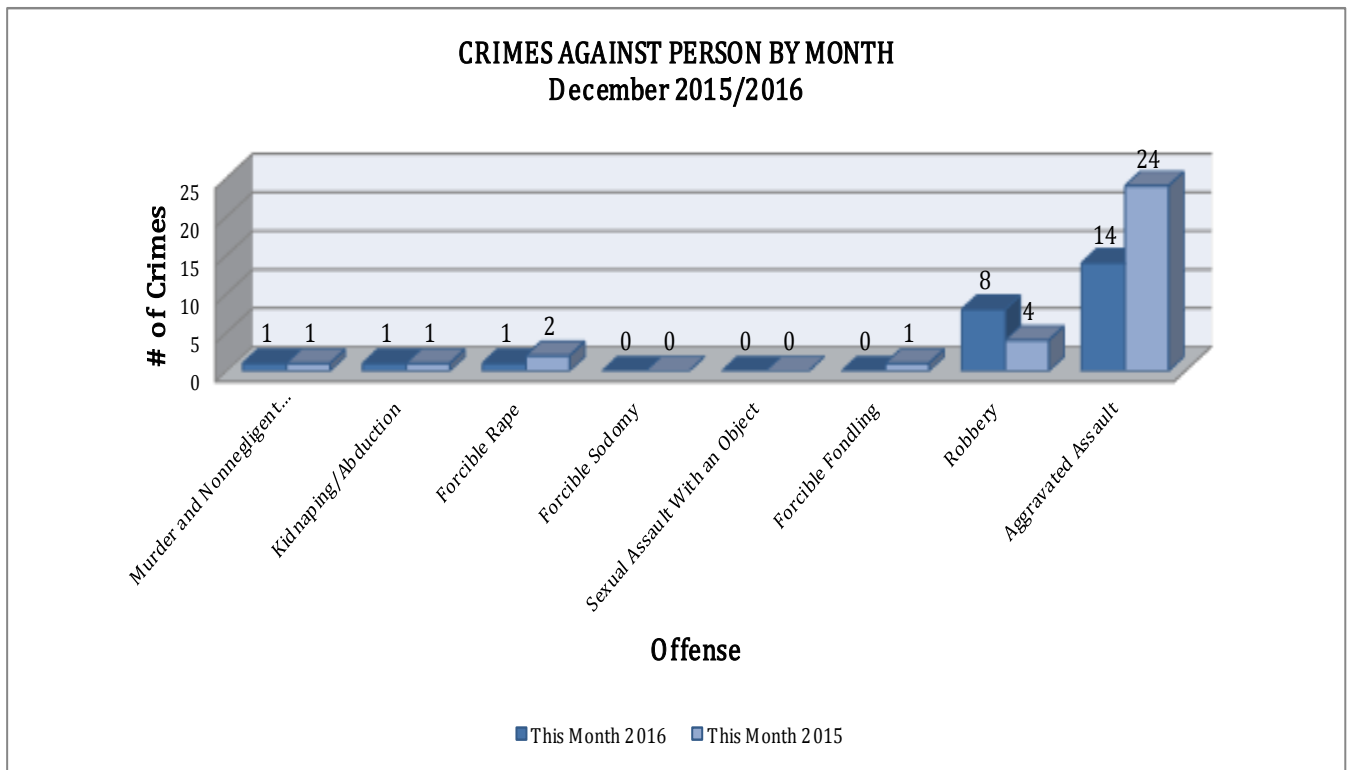

The charts below depict the frequencies of crimes in the month of December from year to year, frequencies of crime by year, and a year to date annual comparison.



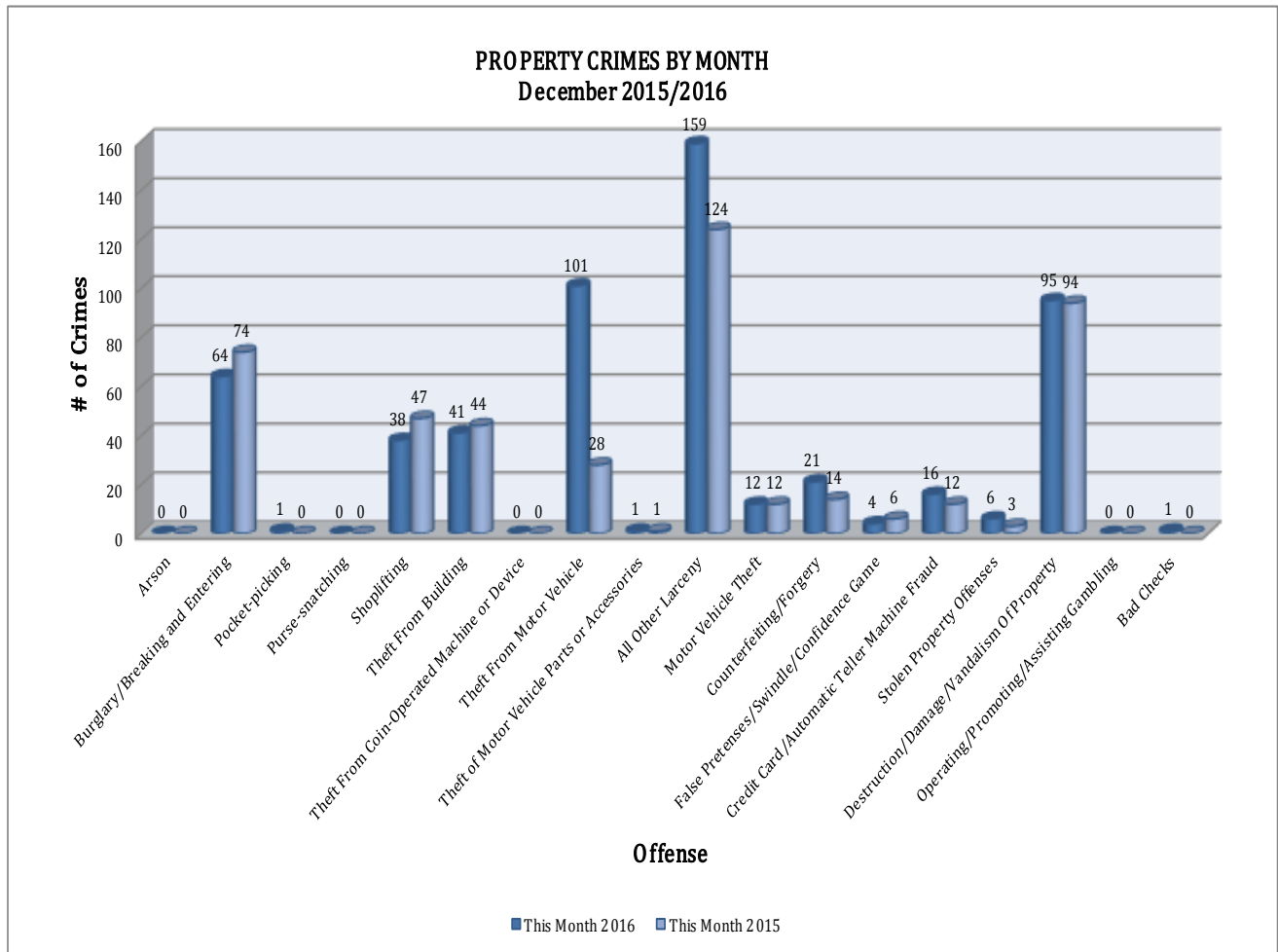
CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 8 NIBRS offenses that make up this section. A total of 25 offenses have been reported this month, down 24% compared to December of last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, the most significant change was Robbery, which is up 100% (up 4 incident) this month. Aggravated Assault is down 42 % (down 10 incident) this month.



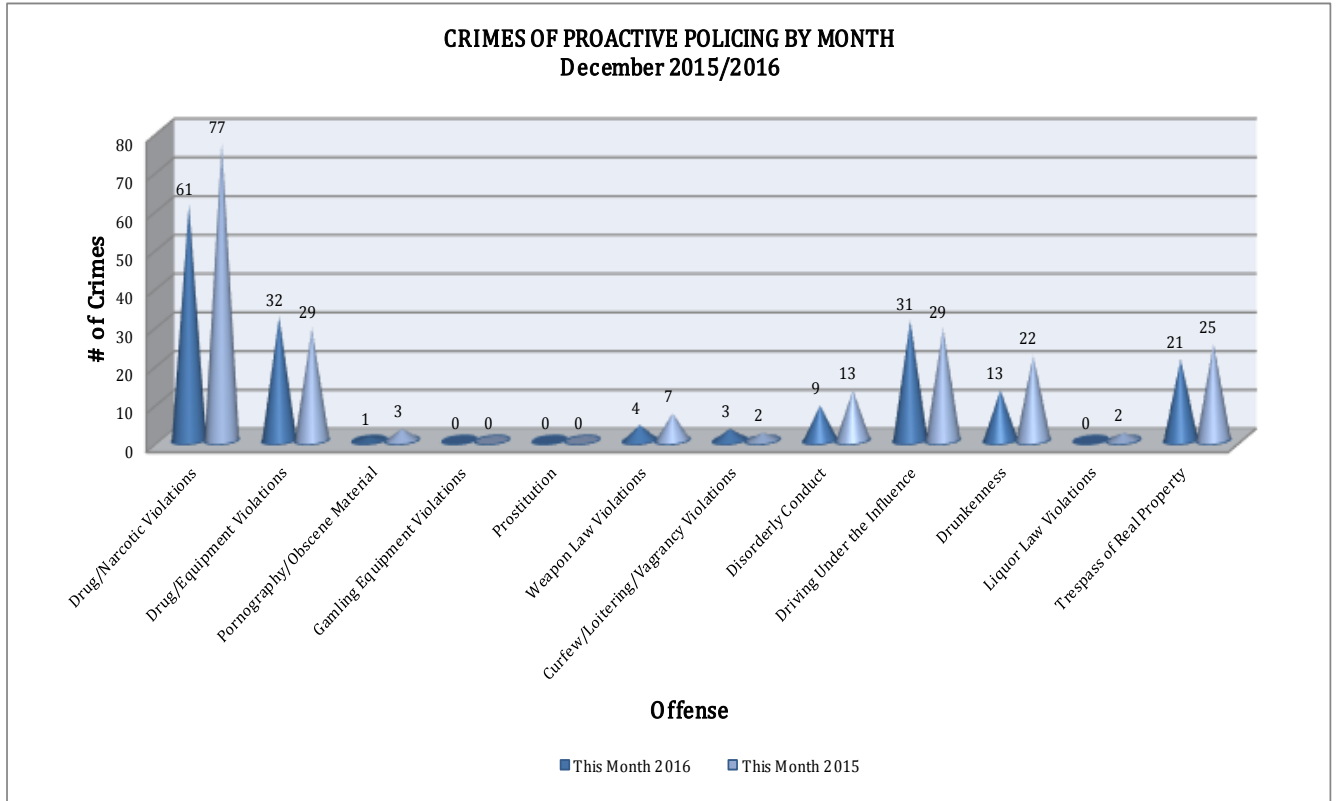
PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for property crimes. This month, there were a total of 560 Property Crimes, a 22% increase when compared to December of last year. Theft from Motor Vehicle is up 261% (a 73 incident increase), Counterfeiting/Forgery is up 50% (a 7 incident increase), while Shoplifting is down 19% (a 9 incident decrease). No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.



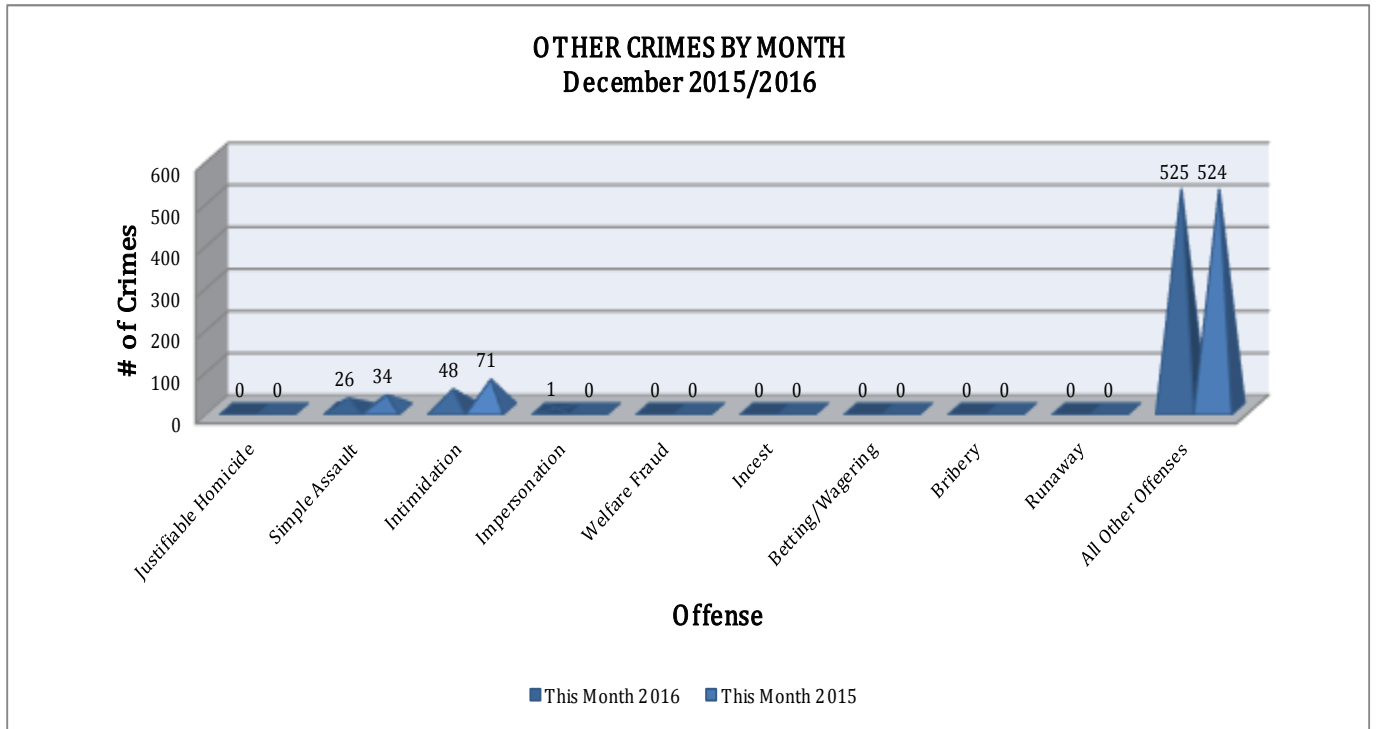
CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve offenses fall under this category. A total of 175 offenses have been reported this month, down 16% compared to December of last year. Drug/Narcotic Violations are down 21% (a 16 incident decrease). Weapon Law Violations are down 43% (a 3 incident decrease), and Drug/Equipment Violations are up 10% (a 3 incident increase). There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.



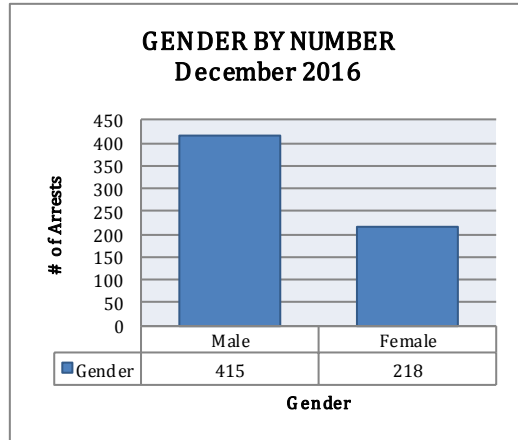
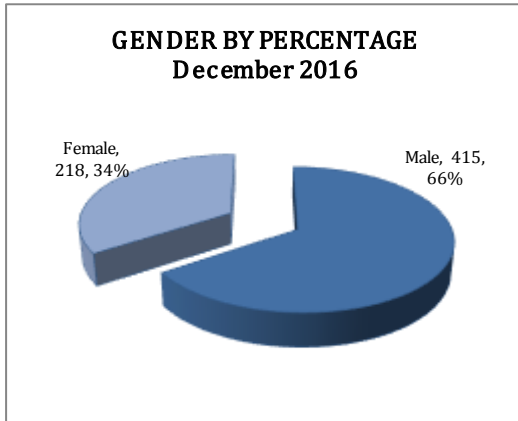
OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 offenses that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 600 Other Crimes reported, a 5% decrease compared to December last year. Intimidation has decreased by 32% (a 23 incident decrease). Simple Assault have decreased by 24% (a 8 incident decrease). No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.

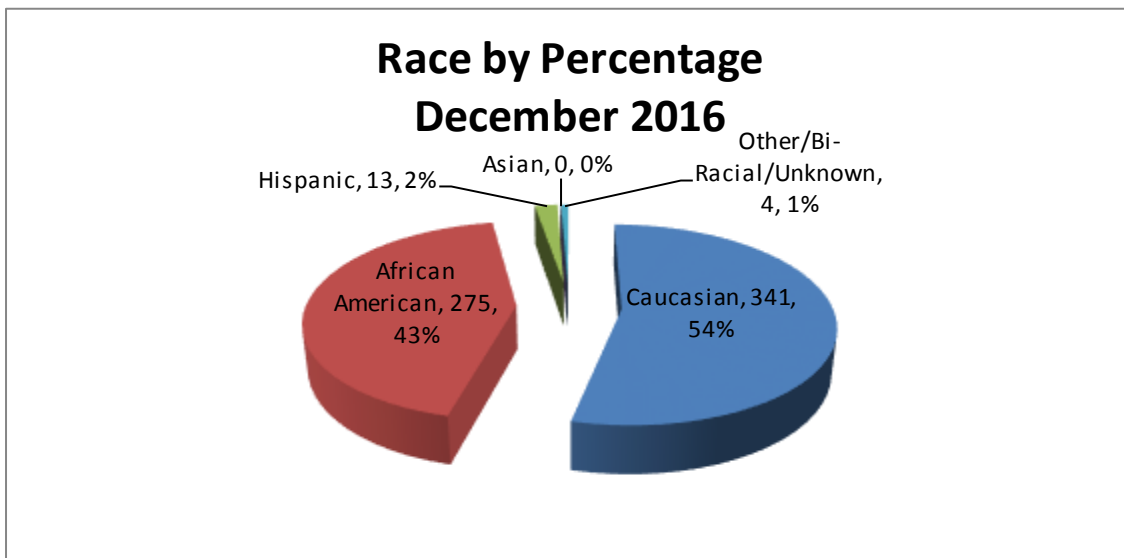


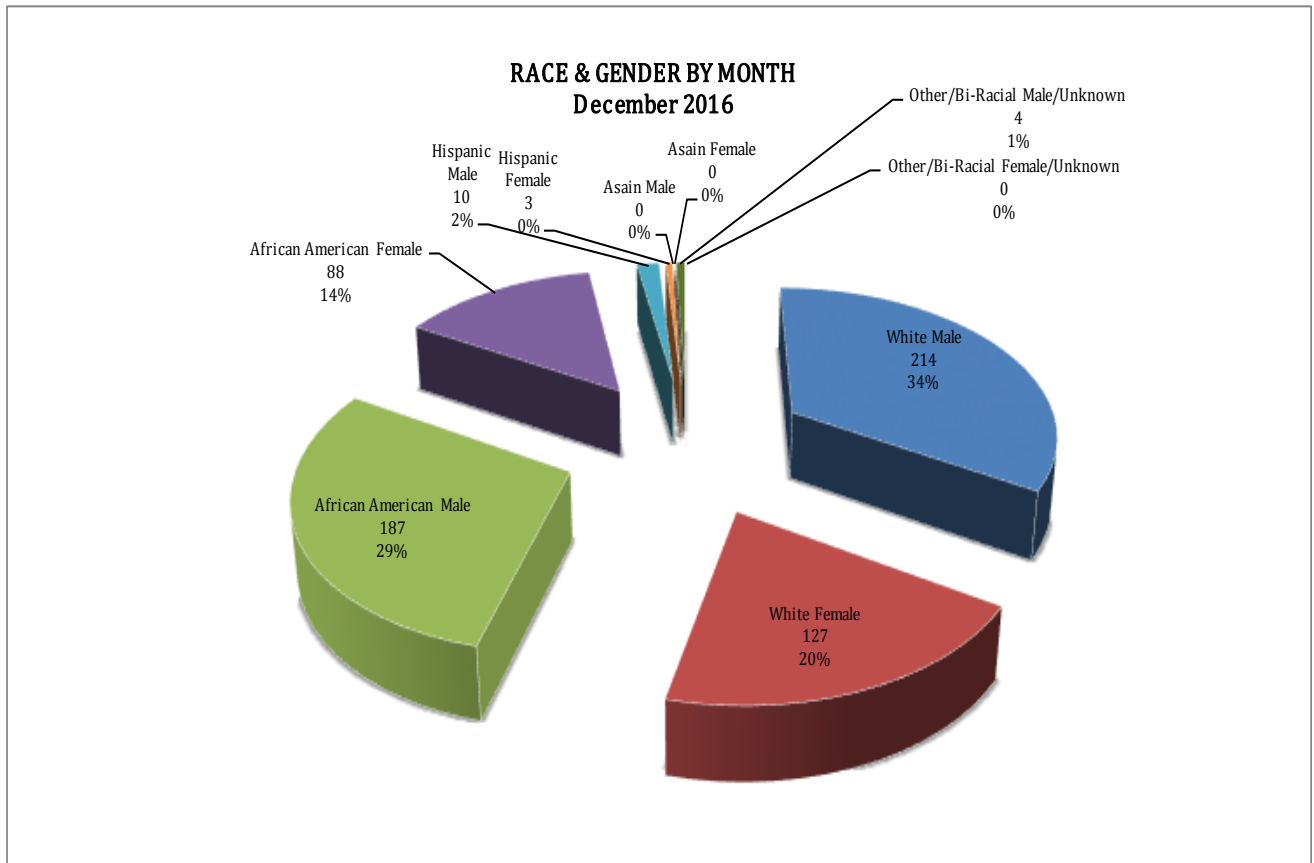
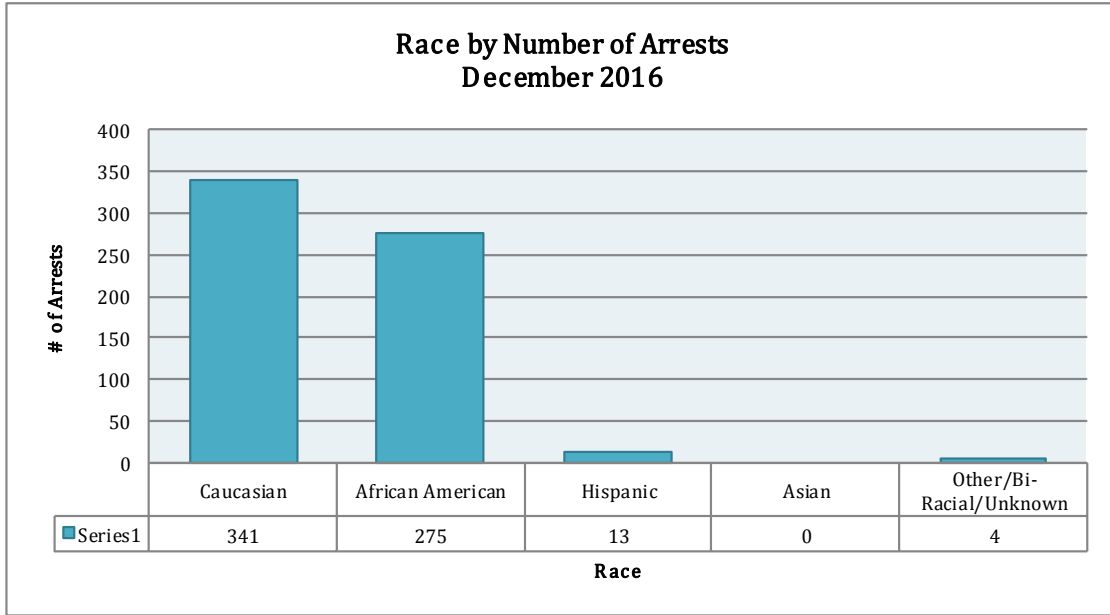
ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In December 2016, there were a total of 633 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 66%, have been male (n= 415), as opposed to 34% of female arrestees (n= 218).



As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (54%) and African American (43%), compared to Hispanic (2%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%). Caucasian males make up the majority at 34% arrestees this month, followed by African American males at 30% arrestees. Caucasian females make up 20%, while African American females make up 14% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 2%, Hispanic females represent 0% of arrestees, Other/Unknown race males made up of 1% of arrestees, 0 females of Other/Unknown race were arrested this month, No Asian males or Asian females were arrested this month.





EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

STREET CRIMES UNIT

The Street Crimes Unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

*Street Crimes was not active December 2016.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

The primary responsibility of CID is to conduct investigations into criminal acts reported to the Jonesboro Police Department. Investigations may encompass initial response, locating and interviewing victims and witnesses, crime scene investigation and reconstruction and evidence gathering, video and computer related evidence retrieval, general and crime specific intelligence gathering, as well as development of suspects and other activities related to the suspect arrest. The unit has members who, in addition to their daily responsibilities, also serve with a variety of state, regional and federal task forces involving financial crimes, crimes against children, internet crimes and others. The primary goal of CID is to collect, preserve and present evidence that conclusively leads to a successful arrest and prosecution. Additionally, the unit works with other department units and city entities toward the prevention of crime and other activities related to maintaining quality of life for the city residents and visitors.

On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
