

JONESBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT Monthly Report February 2016

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PURPOSE STATEMENT


The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Crime in Jonesboro has minimally increased overall, up 13% from this month last year. Total Crime month over month has decreased, from 1210 crimes in February 2012 to 1159 crimes in February 2016. February Crimes Against Persons have increased from last year to this year, up 7 incidents, or 39%. Property Crimes has increased by 82 incidents this year, up 28%. Crimes of Proactive Policing are up this month by 48%. Other Crimes has shown a decrease this month.


CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis Unit consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the Jonesboro Police Department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing; by administration for improved

staffing decisions; and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into: Total Crime, Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.


TOTAL CRIME


The crime activity for the month of February 2016 was at a total of 1,372 NIBRS reportable offenses, a 13% increase compared to the total number of offenses reported in February of last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in February of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 17 crimes per 1,000 population last year.¹ As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 54%, of this month's crime activity (n = 746), Property Crimes comprise of 27% of crimes (n = 371), Crimes of Proactive Policing is comprised of 17% (n = 230) of all reported crimes, and Crimes Against Persons is comprised of 2% (n = 25) of all reported crimes this month.



¹ Note: Population numbers are based on 2012 & 2013 population estimate, where 2012 population estimate is 70,187.


The charts below depict the frequencies of crimes in the month of February from year to year, frequencies of crime by year, and a year to date annual comparison.






CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 NIBRS offenses that make up this section. There were a total of 25 offenses in this area in February this year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, the most significant change was aggravated assault, which increased by 25% (up 3 incidents) this year.




PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for property crimes. This month, there were a total of 371 Property Crimes, a 28% increase compared to February of last year. Theff From Motor Vehicle is up by 170% (17 incident increase), while Motor Vehicle Theff is up 500% (a 10 incident increase). Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property is up 51% (a 28 incident increase). No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.




CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 230 offenses have been reported this month, up 48% compared to February of last year. Drug/Narcotic Violations are up 49% (a 31 incident increase). Drug/Equipment Violations are up 73% (a 16 incident increase). There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.




OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 offenses that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 746 Other Crimes reported, a 1% decrease compared to February last year. Intimidation has increased by 17% (a 8 incident increase). Simple Assaults have increased by 31% (a 9 incident increase). No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.





ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS


In February 2016, there were a total of 736 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 61%, have been male (n= 469), as opposed to 36% of female arrestees (n= 267).



As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (51%) and African American (47%), compared to Hispanic (2%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (0%). African American males make up the majority at 33% arrestees this month, followed by Caucasian males at 29% arrestees. Caucasian females make up 22%, while African American females make up 14% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 1%, Hispanic females make up less than 1%, Other/Unknown race males represent less than 1% of arrestees, 0 females of Other/Unknown race were arrested this month, Asian females make up less than 1% and 0 Asian males arrested this month.







EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

The primary responsibility of CID is to conduct investigations into criminal acts reported to the Jonesboro Police Department. Investigations may encompass initial response, locating and interviewing victims and witnesses, crime scene investigation and reconstruction and evidence gathering, video and computer related evidence retrieval, general and crime specific intelligence gathering, as well as development of suspects and other activities related to the suspect arrest. The unit has members who, in addition to their daily responsibilities, also serve with a variety of state, regional and federal task forces involving financial crimes, crimes against children, internet crimes and others. The primary goal of CID is to collect, preserve and present evidence that conclusively leads to a successful arrest and prosecution. Additionally, the unit works with other department units and city entities toward the prevention of crime and other activities related to maintaining quality of life for the city residents and visitors.

WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summons, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
