

JONESBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT Monthly Report JANUARY 2014

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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.


CRIME ANALYSIS


The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, with presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

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TOTAL CRIME


The crime activity for the month of January 2014 was at a total of 1,439 NIBRIS reportable offenses, a -3% increase, comparing to the total of offenses reported in January of the last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 71,527, the crime rate in January of this year was at 21 crimes per 1,000 population, comparing to 20 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, a 3% increase. As indicated on a pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 63%, of this month's crime activity (n = 905). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 24% of all the crimes (n = 339). Following in third and fourth places are, respectively, Crimes of Proactive Policing, comprising of 12% (n = 175) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 1% (n = 20) of all the crimes this month.






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CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 20 offenses in this area in January this year, -13%, comparing to January of the last year. There were 4 less Robberies reported this year. As demonstrated on the bar chart below, there are no other significant changes in frequencies for the crimes in this category.


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PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 339 Property Crimes, a -18% decrease, comparing to January of the last year. The data indicates change in Counterfeiting /


Forgery, down -67%, Theft from Building is down -33%, Burglary/Breaking & Entering is down -16%, and Theft from Motor Vehicle is down -29%, while compared to January of last year.



CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING


Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As the chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 175 offenses have been reported this month, down -10%, comparing to January of the last year. Driving Under the Influence is down -47%. There are no other significant changes noted for the offenses in this category.

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OTHER CRIMES

There are 11 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 905 Other Crimes reported, a 18% increase, comparing to January of the last year. All Other Offenses increased by 18%. Intimidation is up 52%. No other significant changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.




ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In January 2014, there were a total of 920 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department, up 9%, comparing with the last year's data for the month of January. The rate of arrests per offense increased 6% this month, comparing to the rate from the previous year. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees,

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
66%, have been male (n = 610), as opposed to 34% of female arrestees (n = 310). As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (51%) and African American (46%), as opposed to Hispanic (2%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%).



Caucasian males make up the majority, 32%, of arrestees this month (n = 296). African American males make up 32% of arrestees for the month of January (n = 294). Caucasian females make up 18% (n = 169) and African American females make up 15% (n = 133) of

arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 2% (n = 18), while Hispanic Females make up 1% of arestees this month (n = 5). There were 2 Males and 2 Females of unknown race or ethnicity arested in January.

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EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible

for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

Additionally, CID is charged with clearing additional crimes, recovering stolen property, preventing additional crimes, and gathering intelligence information.

WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.



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
TRAFFIC
