#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

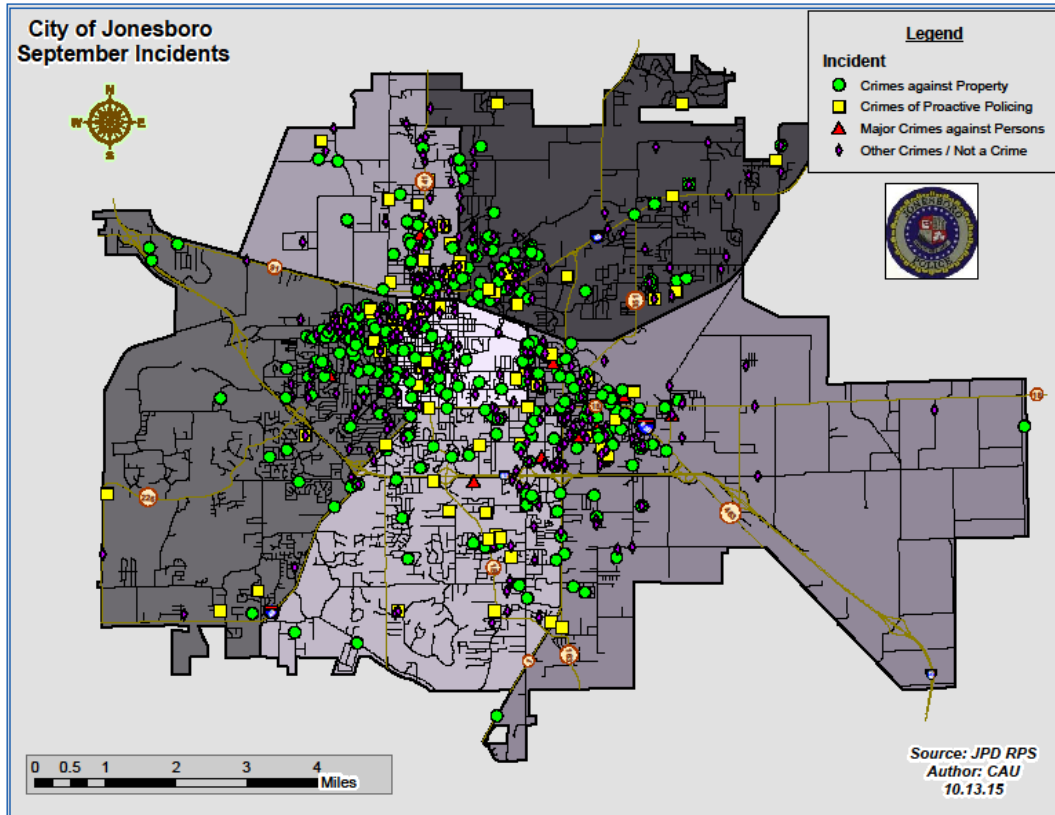
*The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.*

Crime in Jonesboro has increased overall, up 2% from this month last year. Total Crime month over month has decreased, from 1314 crimes in September 2014 to 1293 crimes in September 2015. Crimes Against Persons has increased from last year to this year, up 3 incidents, or 12%. Property Crimes has also increased by 12 incidents this year, up 3%. Crimes of Proactive Policing are down this month by 40%. Other Crimes has shown a decrease this month.

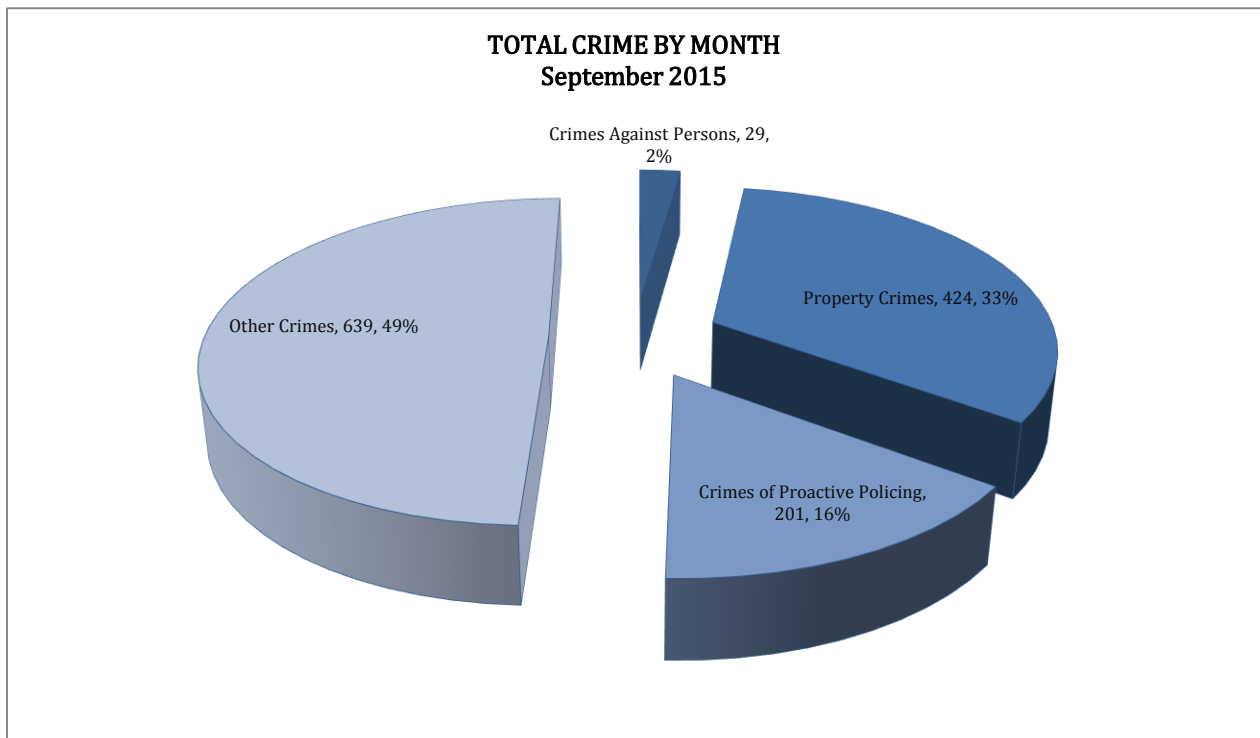
## CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis Unit consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the Jonesboro Police Department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing; by administration for improved staffing decisions; and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into: Total Crime, Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

## TOTAL CRIME

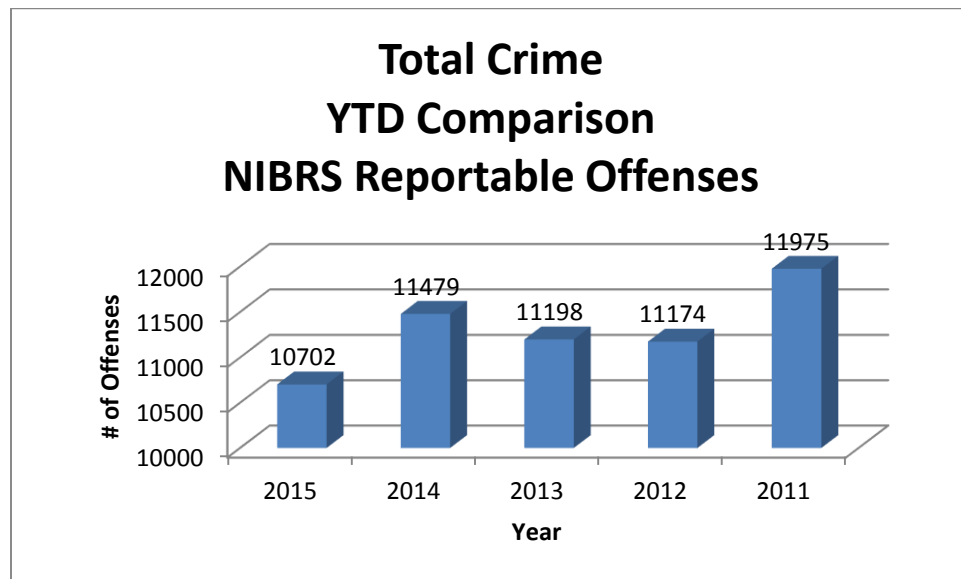
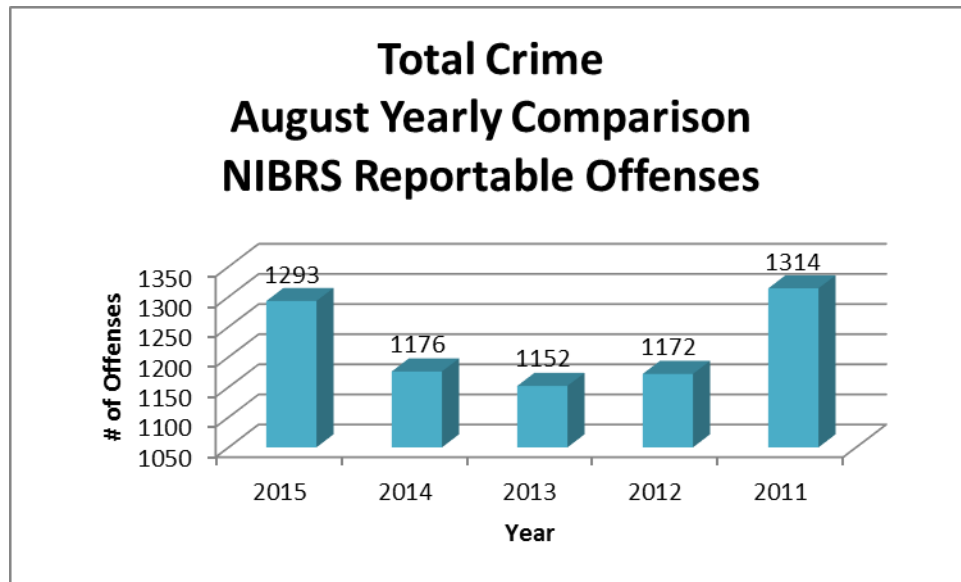
The crime activity for the month of September 2015 was at a total of 1293 NIBRS reportable offenses, a 2% increase compared to the total number of offenses reported in September of last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in September of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 17 crimes per 1,000 population last year.<sup>1</sup> As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 49%, of this month's crime activity ( $n = 639$ ), Property Crimes comprise of 33% of crimes ( $n = 424$ ), Crimes of Proactive Policing is comprised of 16% ( $n = 201$ ) of all reported crimes, and Crimes Against Persons is comprised of 2% ( $n = 29$ ) of all reported crimes this month.

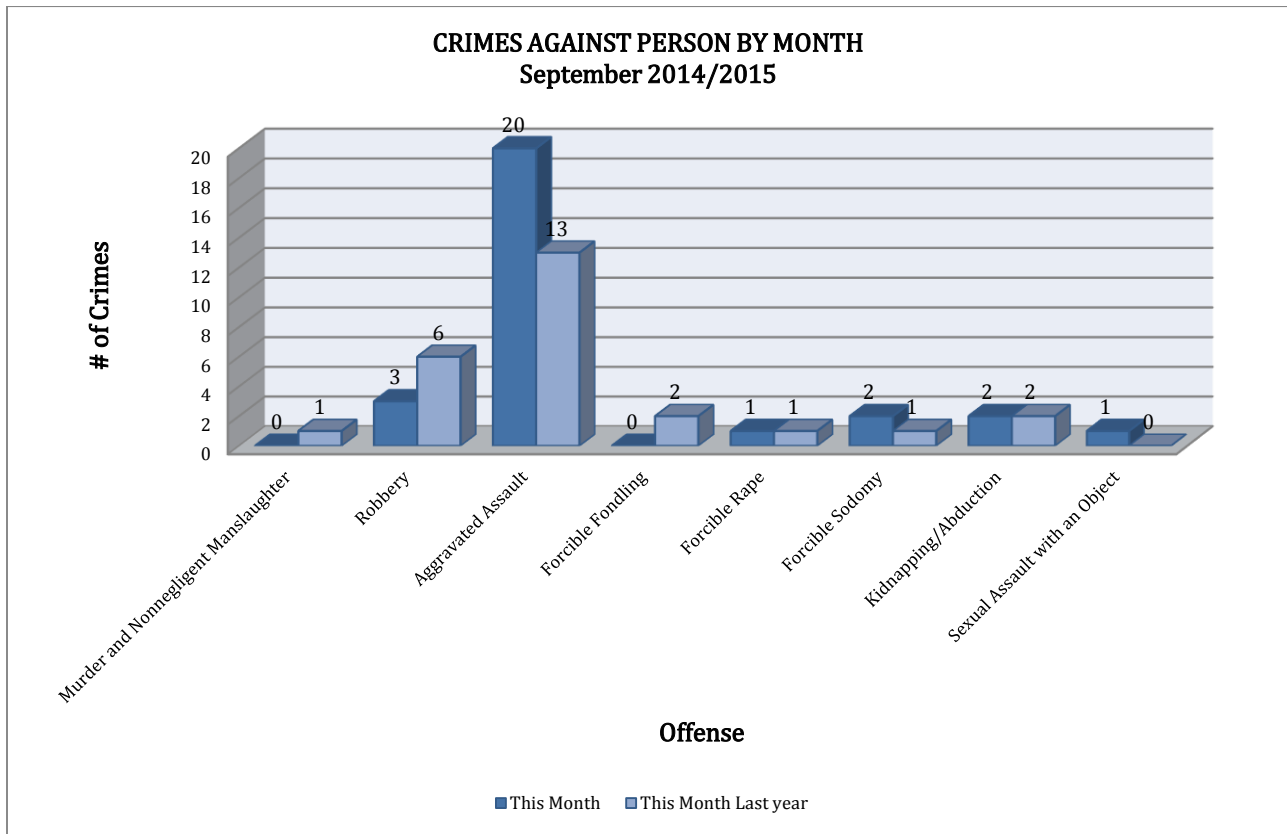
The charts below depict the frequencies of crimes in the month of September from year to year, frequencies of crime by year, and a year to date annual comparison.

### CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

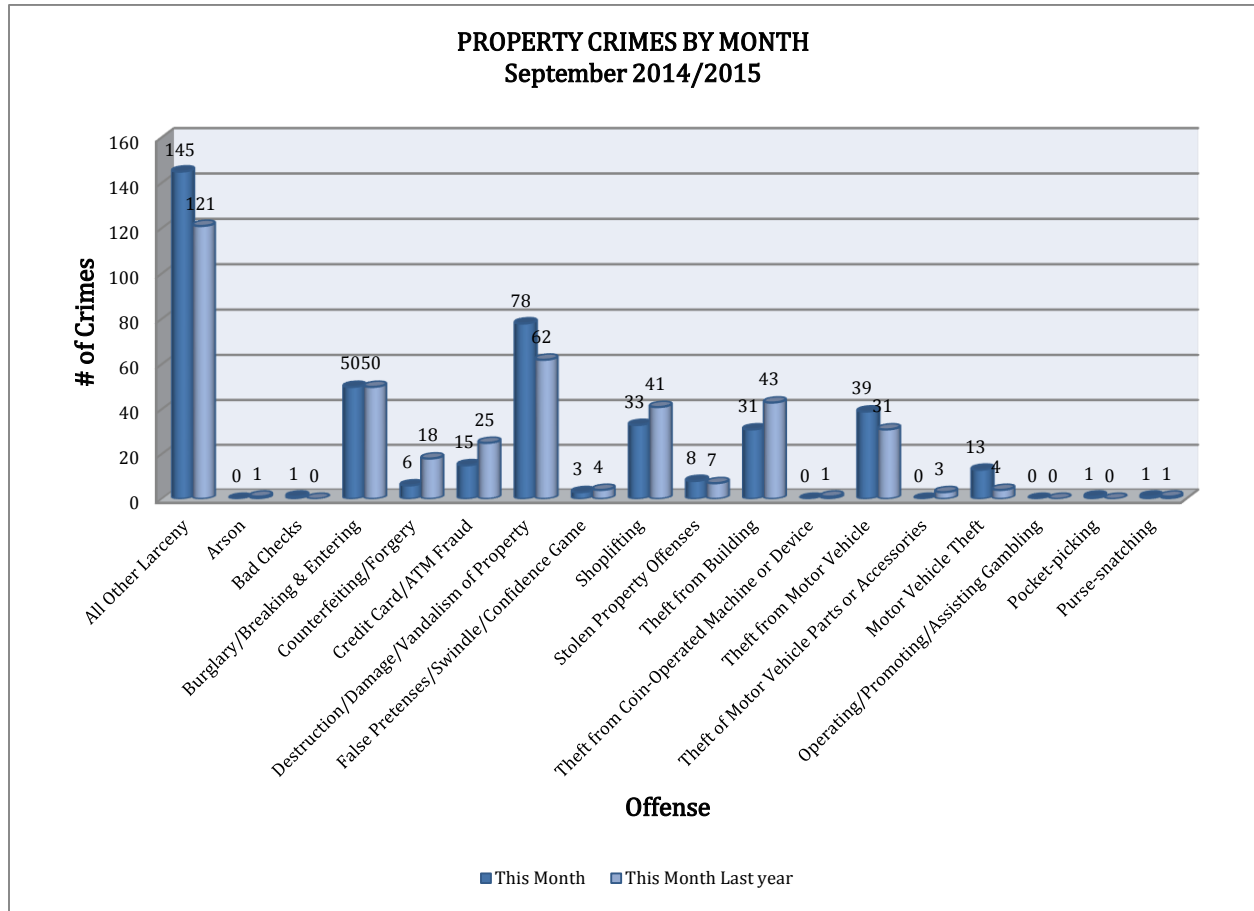
There are 9 NIBRIS offenses that make up this section. There were a total of 29 offenses in this area in September this year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, the most significant change was aggravated assault, which decreased by 54% (7 incidents) this year.

### PROPERTY CRIMES

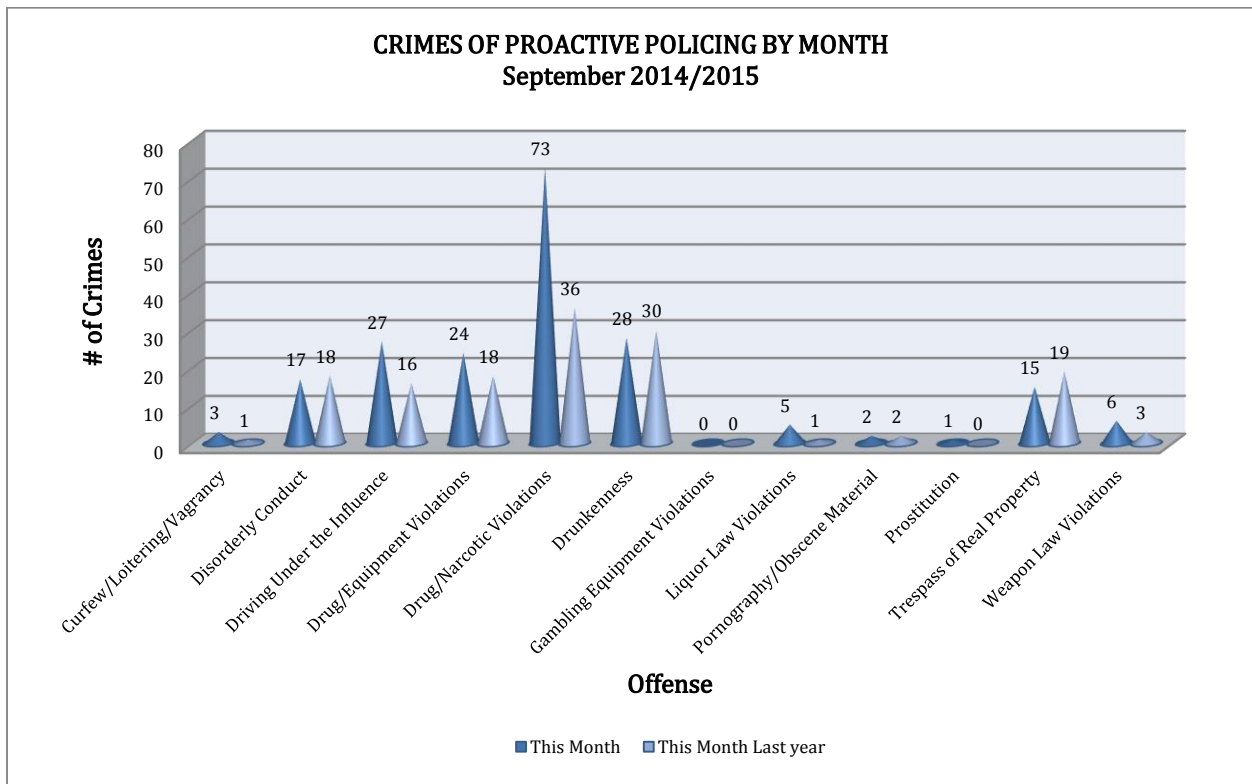
This section displays the criminal activity for property crimes. This month, there were a total of 424 Property Crimes, a 3% increase compared to September of last year. Credit Card/ATM fraud is down this month by 40% (10 fewer incidents), while Shoplifting is also down by 20% (8 fewer incidents). Motor Vehicle Theft is up by 225% (9 more incidents). No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.

### CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

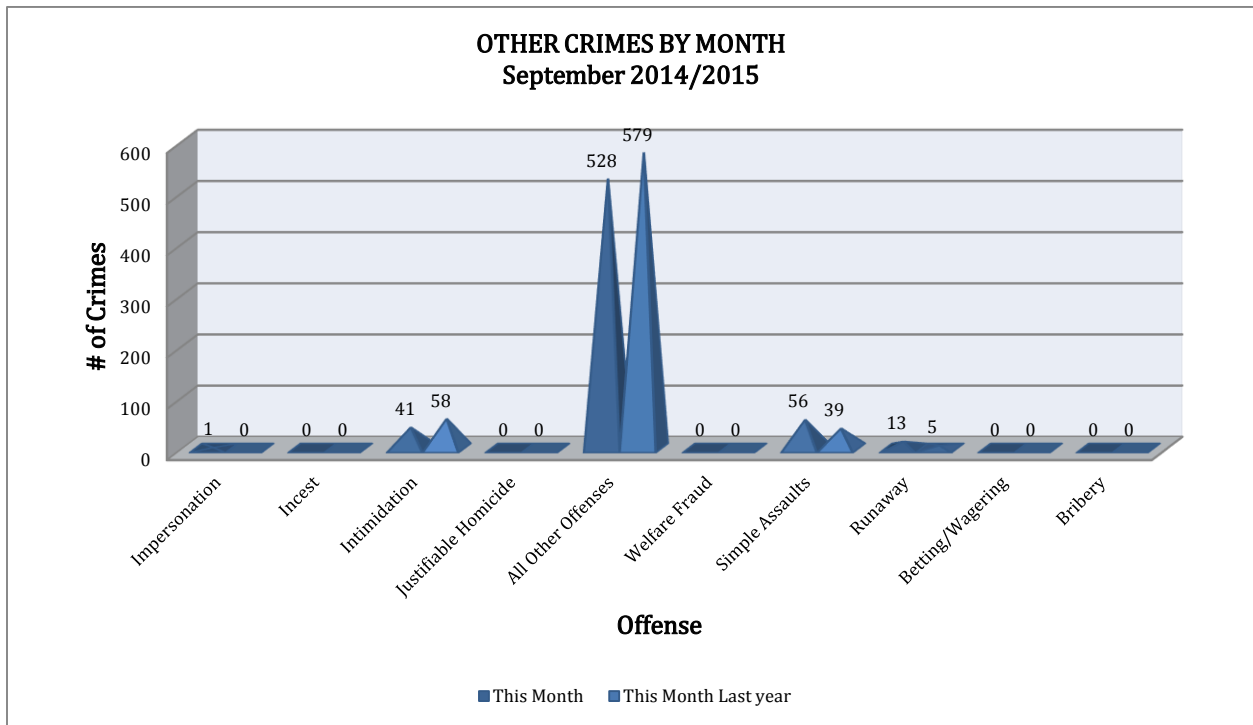
Crimes of Proactive Policing are crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 201 offenses have been reported this month, up 40%, compared to September of last year. Liquor Law Violations are up 400% (4 more incidents). Trespass of real property is down 21% (4 fewer incidents). Disorderly conduct is down 6% (1 fewer incident). There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.

## OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 offenses that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 639 Other Crimes reported, a 6% decrease compared to September last year. Runaways have increased by 160% (8 more incidents). Intimidation has decreased by 29% (17 fewer incidents). All other offenses have decreased by 9% (51 fewer incidents). No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.

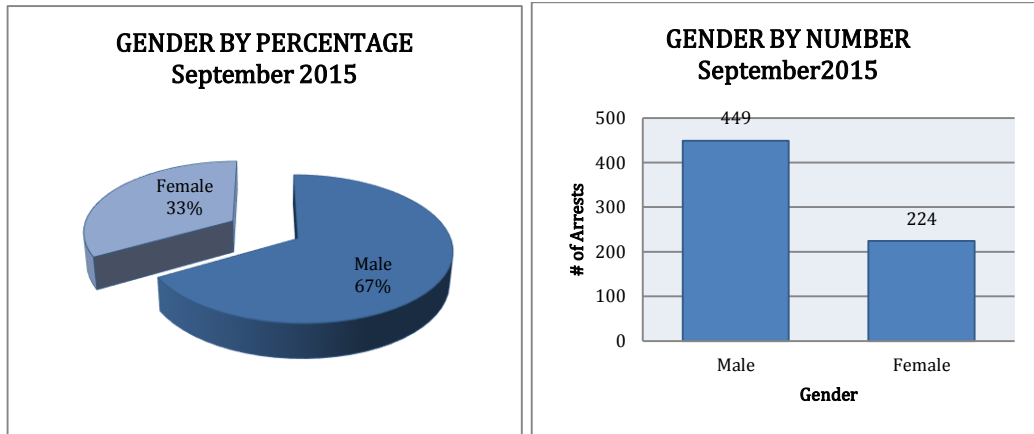




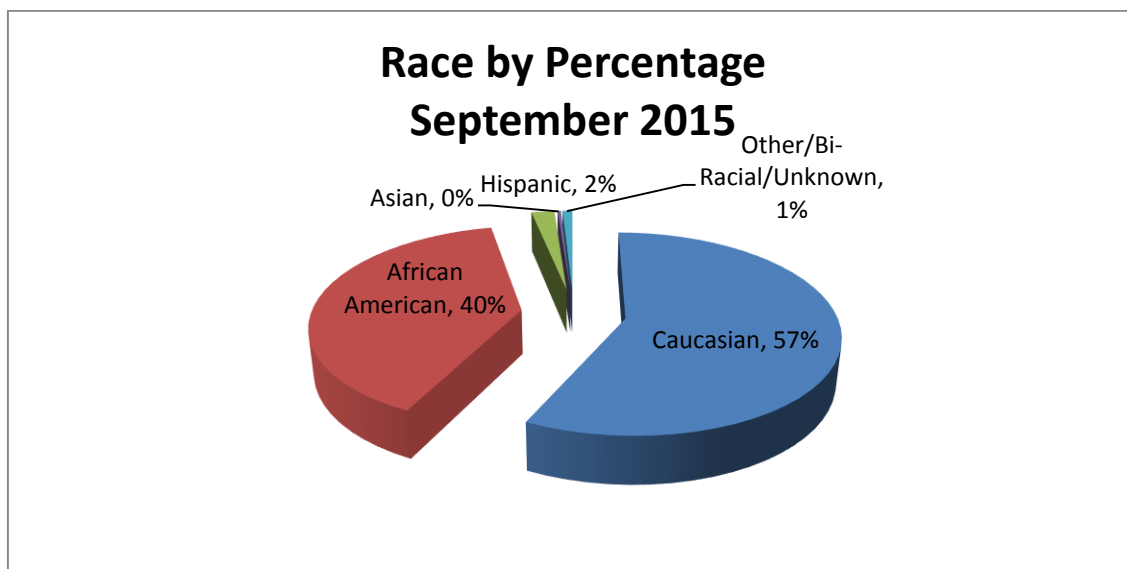

### ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In September 2015, there were a total of 673 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 67%, have been male ( $n= 449$ ), as opposed to 33% of female arrestees ( $n= 224$ ).

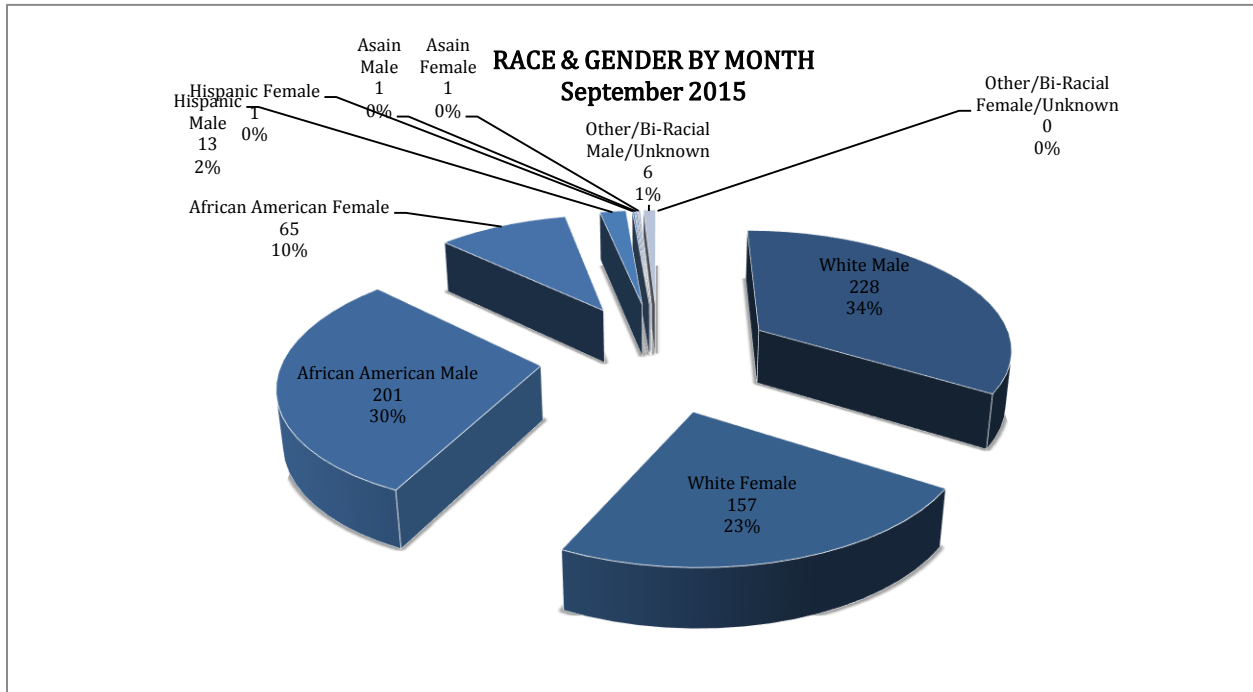
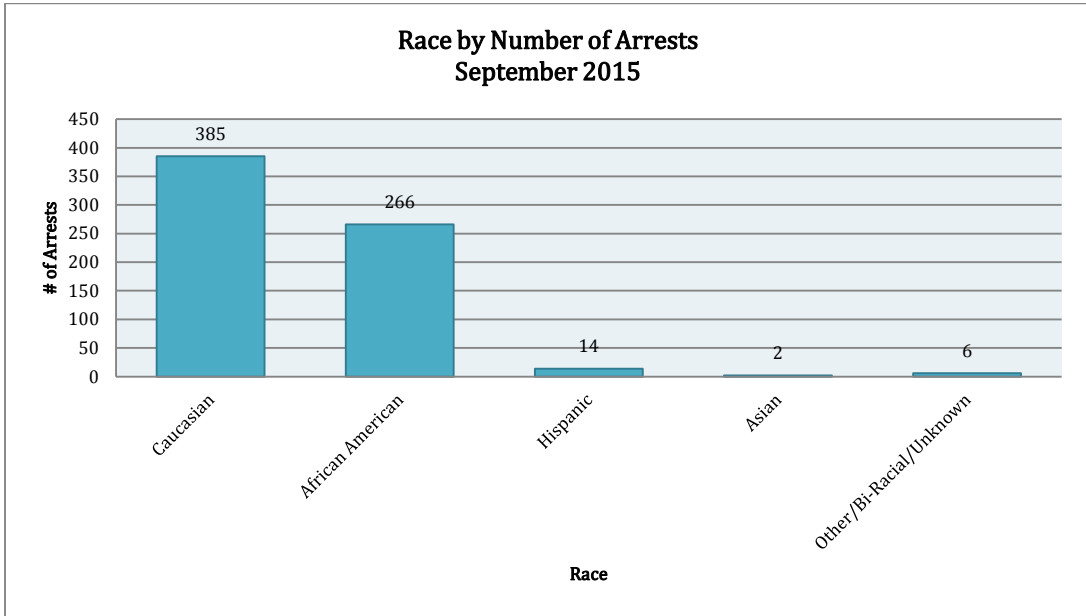


As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (57%) and African American (40%), comparing to Hispanic (2%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%). Caucasian males make up the majority, at 34% of arrestees this month, followed by African American males at 30%. Caucasian females make up 23% , while African American females make up 10% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 2%, Other/Unknown race males represent less than 1% of arrestees, and females of Other/Unknown race make up for less than 1%, There were 1 Asian male and 1 Asian female arrested this month.

**EMERGENCY 911**

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

**UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION**

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

**CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION**

The primary responsibility of CID is to conduct investigations into criminal acts reported to the Jonesboro Police Department. Investigations may encompass initial response, locating and interviewing victims and witnesses, crime scene investigation and reconstruction and evidence gathering, video and computer related evidence retrieval, general and crime specific intelligence gathering, as well as development of suspects and other activities related to the suspect arrest. The unit has members who, in addition to their daily responsibilities, also serve with a variety of state, regional and federal task forces involving financial crimes, crimes against children, internet crimes and others. The primary goal of CID is to collect, preserve and present evidence that conclusively leads to a successful arrest and prosecution. Additionally, the unit works with other department units and city entities toward the prevention of crime and other activities related to maintaining quality of life for the city residents and visitors.

**WARRANTS**

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summons, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
