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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, Total Crime Monthly Comparison, and Next Month Predictions.

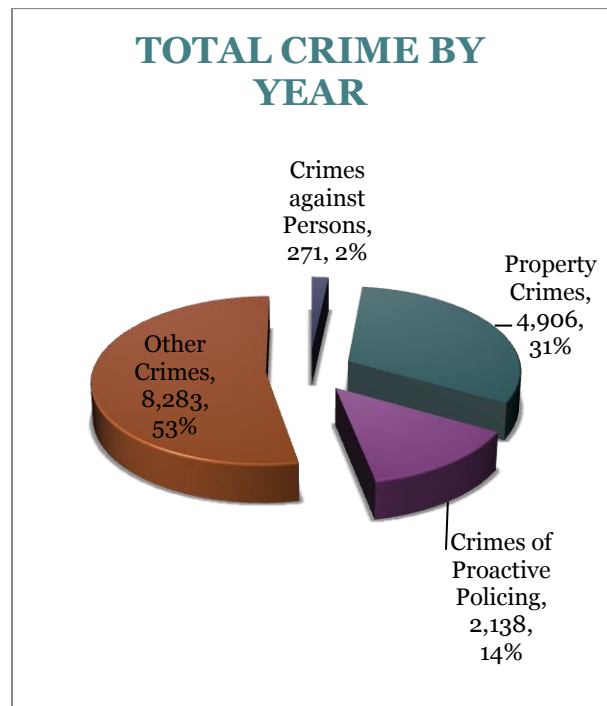
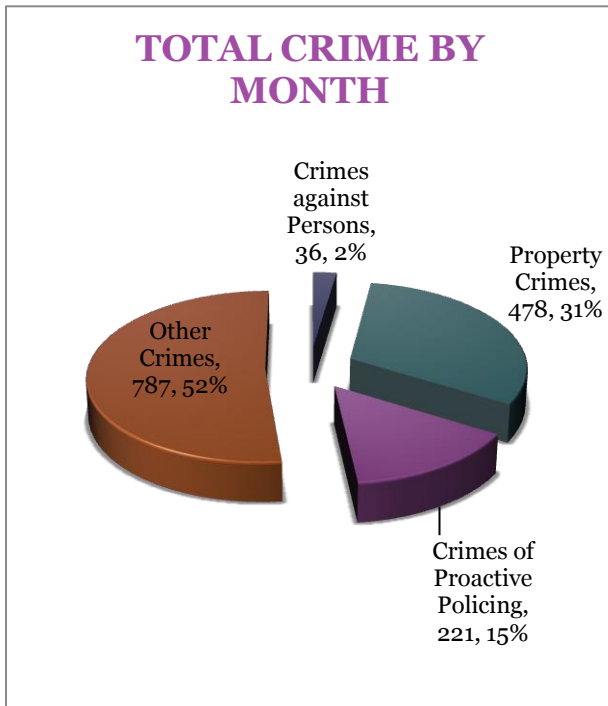
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TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of October 2012 was at a total of 1,522 NIBRIS reportable offenses, a 10% decrease, comparing to a total of offenses in October last year. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,351, the crime rate was at 23 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of October this year, comparing to 25 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, a 10% decrease. As indicated on a pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 52%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 787$). Property crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 31% of all the crimes ($n = 478$). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 15% ($n = 221$) and crimes against persons at 2% ($n = 36$), respectively.

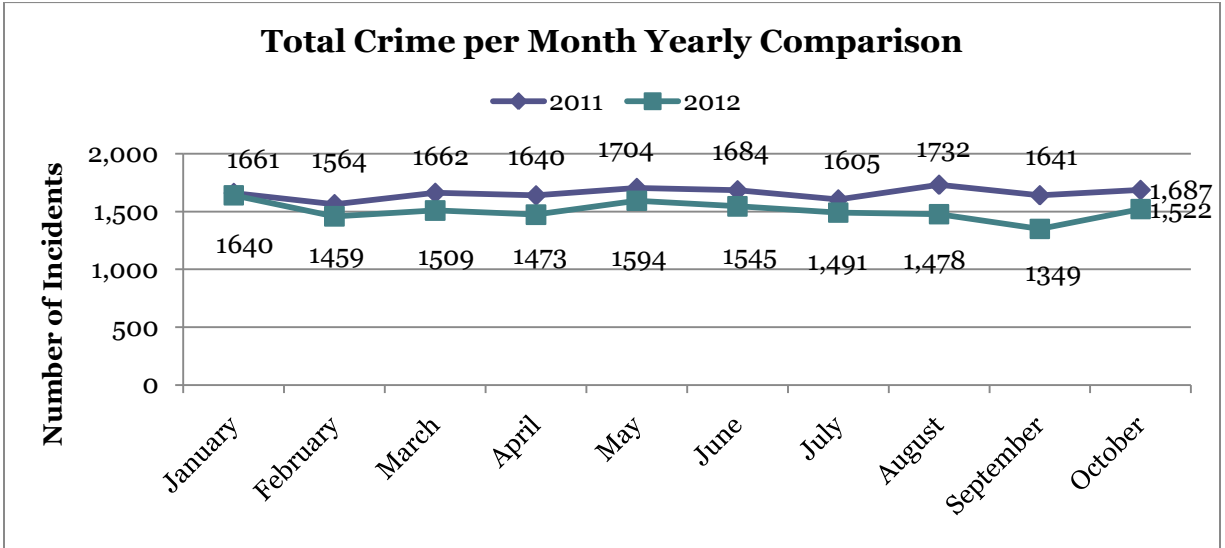
Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through October 2012. A total of 15,598 NIBRIS reportable offenses were reported in 2012, a 17% decrease, comparing to the same period last year. The year to date crime rate amounts to 232 offenses per 1,000 population, compared to 279 offenses per 1,000 population last year (down 9.8%). A 53% of all the crimes is attributed to Other Crimes category ($n = 8,283$). Property Crimes comprise of 31% of all the crimes to date, where $n = 4,906$. Crimes of Proactive Policing amount to 14% ($n = 2,138$) and crimes against persons comprise of 2% of a total year to date number of crimes ($n = 271$).

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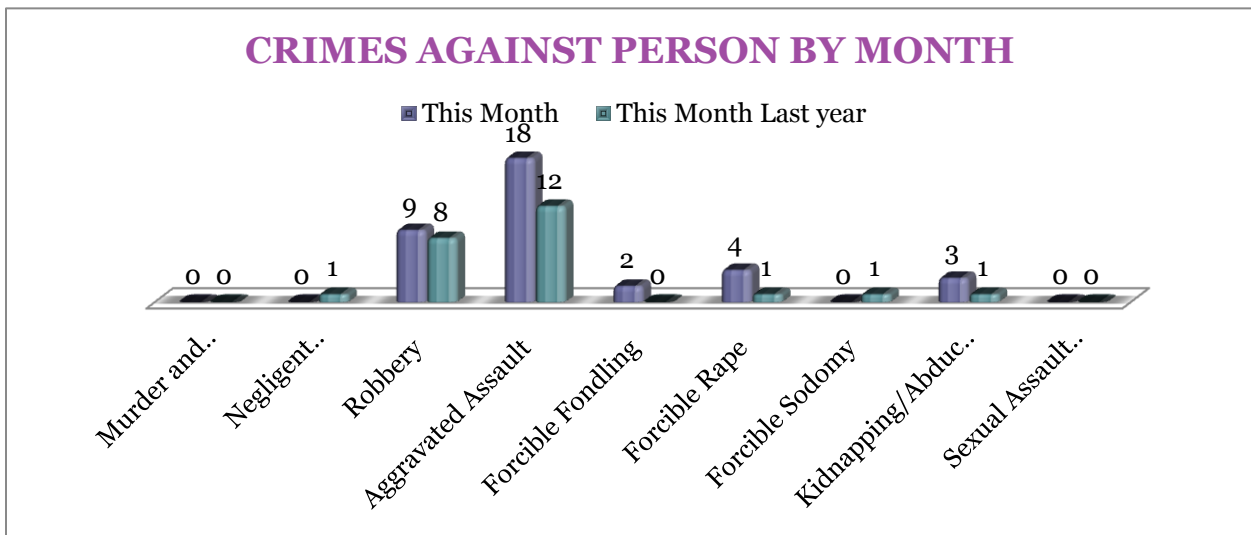
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CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 36 offenses in this area this month, a 50% decrease, comparing to the last year's total in October. Aggravated Assaults are down

50% this month. There were 3 more Forcible Rapes this month, comparing to the last year. As demonstrated on the bar chart below, there are no significant changes in other crimes for this category.

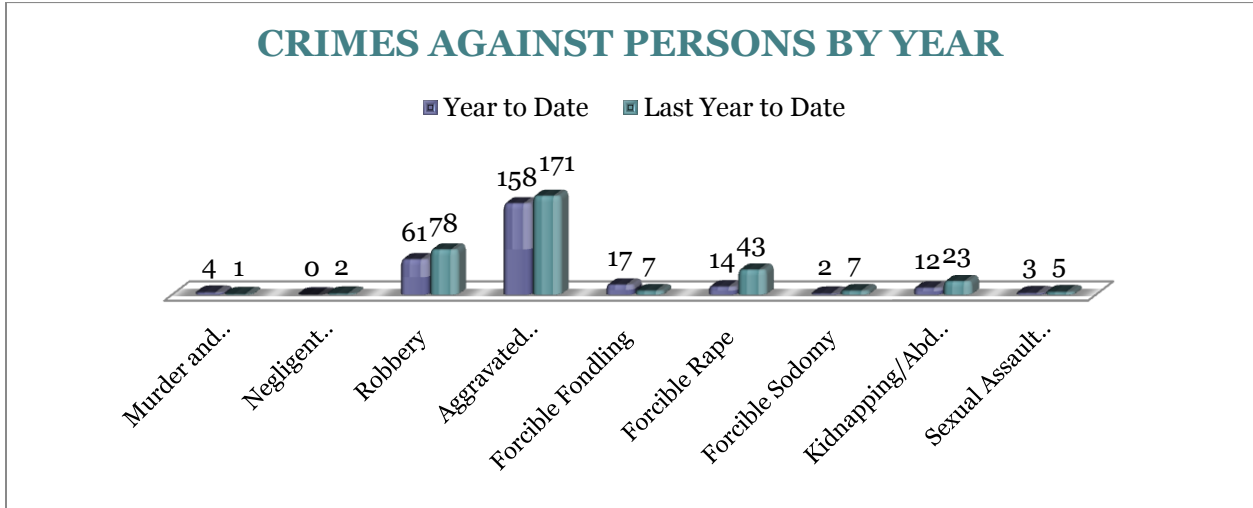


A bar graph on the following page shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons, which amounts to a total of 271 incidents for this category of crimes, a 20% decrease, comparing to the year to date

data of last year. Forcible Foundlings are up by 10 offences. Robberies are down 22%, and forcible rapes are down 67%. To date we have 3 more murders than last year to date.

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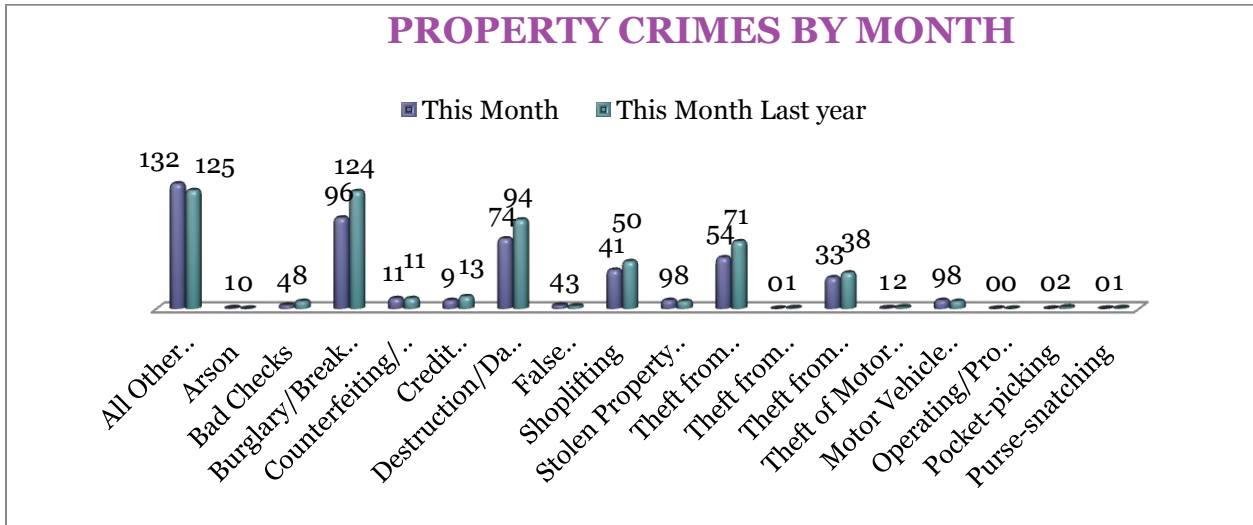
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PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 478 Property Crimes, a 14% decrease comparing to October of last year. The data indicates a

significant change in, Burglary/Breaking & Entering (down 23%), Destruction / Damage / Vandalism (down 21%), and Theft from Building (down 24%). The All Other Larceny is up 6%.



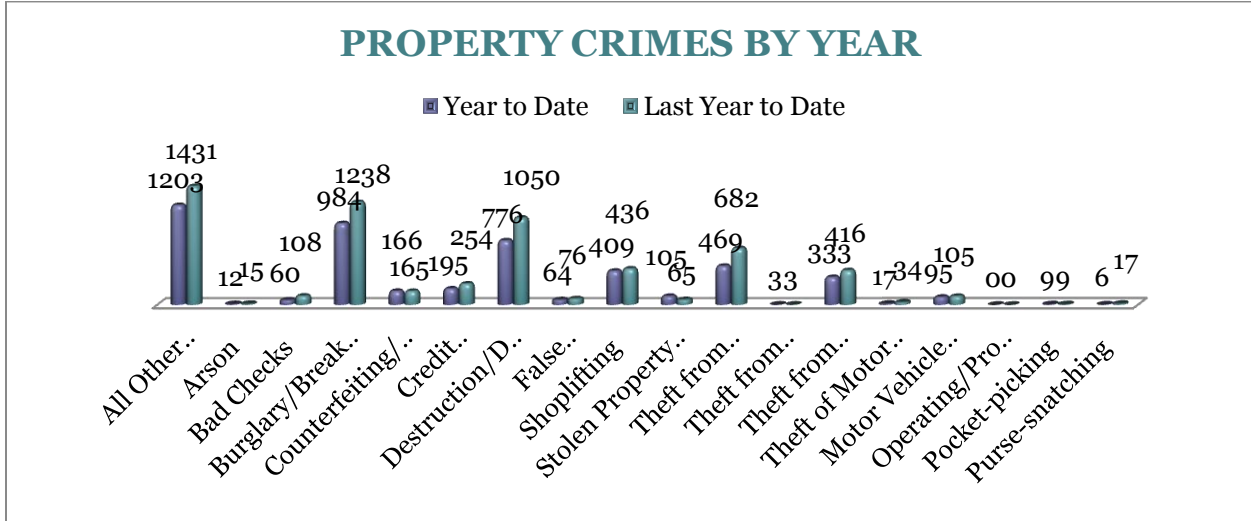
To date this year, 4,906 property offenses have occurred, a 20% decrease, comparing to the last year's data at this same time. The following significant changes are noted this year: All Other Larceny (down 16%), Bad Checks (down 44%), Burglary/Breaking

or Entering (down 21%), Credit Card / ATM Fraud (down 23%), Destruction/ Damage/Vandalism (down 26%), Shoplifting (down 6%), Theft from Building (down 31%), Theft from Motor Vehicle (down 20%), Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts and

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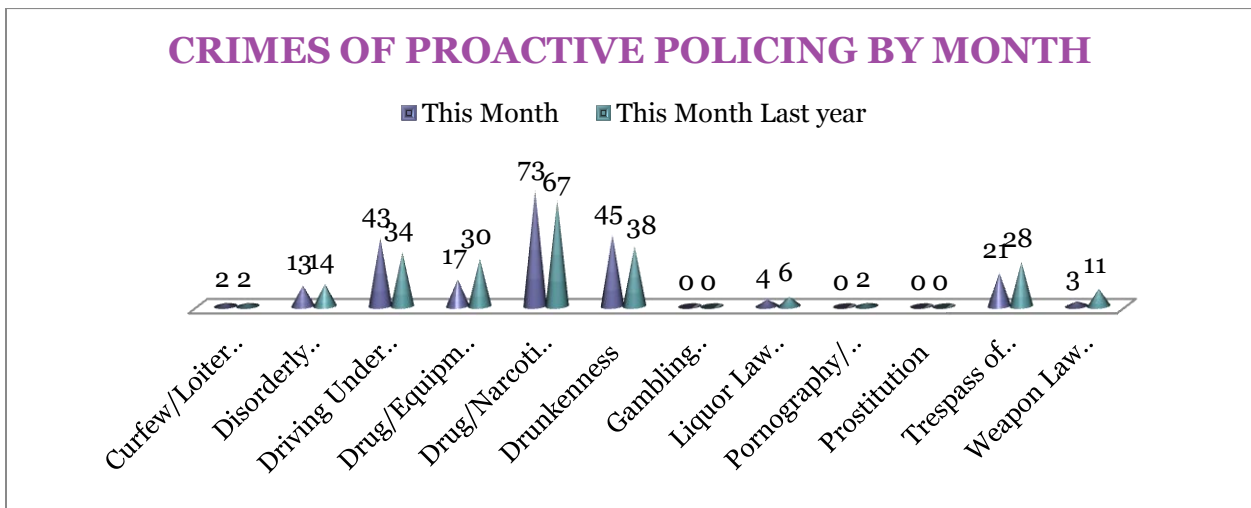
Accessories (down 50%), Motor Vehicle Theft (down 10%), and Purse Snatching (down 65%). Stolen Property Offenses increased by 62%.



CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 221 offenses have

been reported this month, a 5% decrease, comparing to October last year. There is a significant increase in Driving Under the Influence (up 26%); Drug/Narcotic Violations are up 9% and Drunkenness offenses increased 18%. Weapon Law Violations are down 73%.



To date for the year 2012, there have been 2,138 crimes of proactive policing reported, an overall 3% increase, comparing to the last year's to date data.

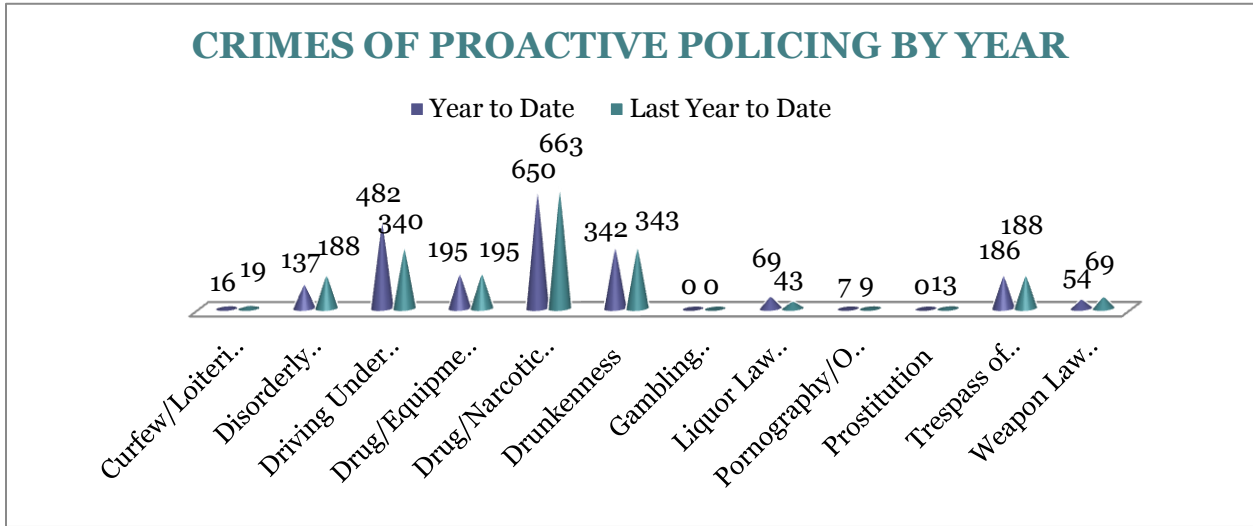
Driving Under the Influence is up 42% and Liquor Law Violations increased by 60% this year. Disorderly Conduct is down 27% and Weapon Law Violations decreased by 22%

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this year. Prostitution is down 100%. There are no statistically significant changes

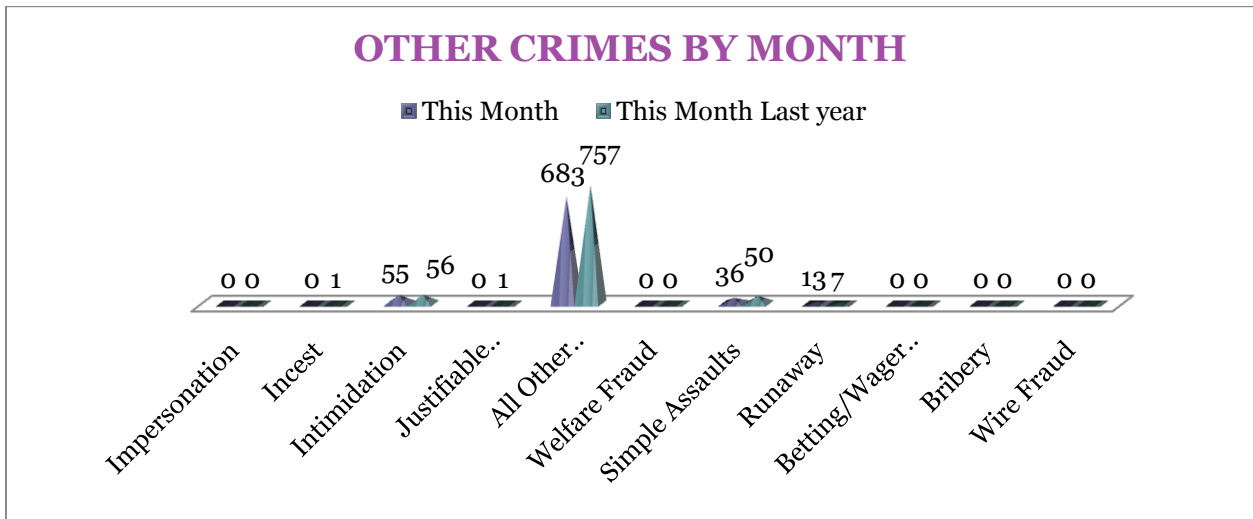
noted for other offenses in this category.



OTHER CRIMES

There are 11 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 787 Other Crimes, a 10% decrease, comparing to last October (n = 872). Intimidation is down 2% and Simple

Assaults are down 23%. Also all other offences are down 10%. No other significant changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.

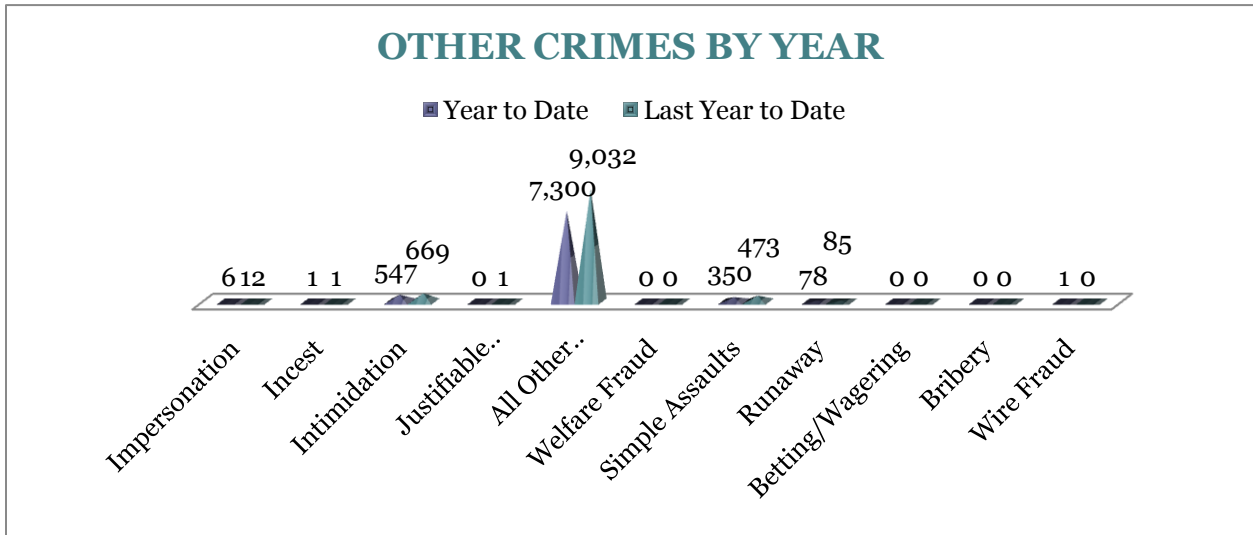


To date this year, there have been 8,283 Other Crimes offenses, a 19% decrease comparing to the last year's to date data. Intimidation offenses were reported 18% less than in last year, Simple Assaults decreased by 26% and Impersonation

offenses are down 50%. All Other Offenses decreased by 19%. No statistically significant changes have been observed for other offenses within this category, comparing to the last year's data.

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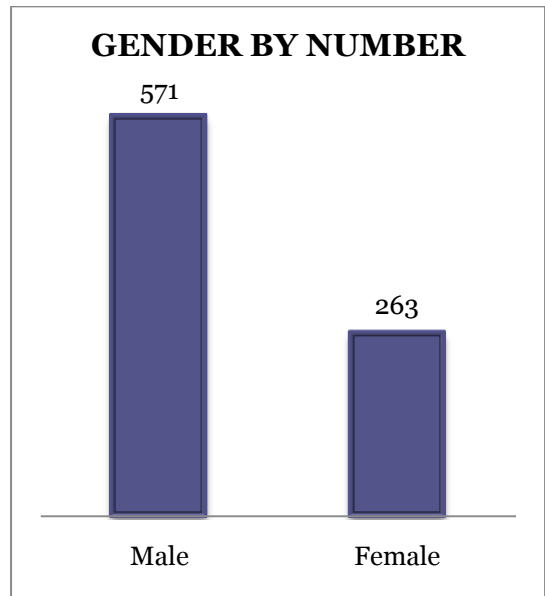
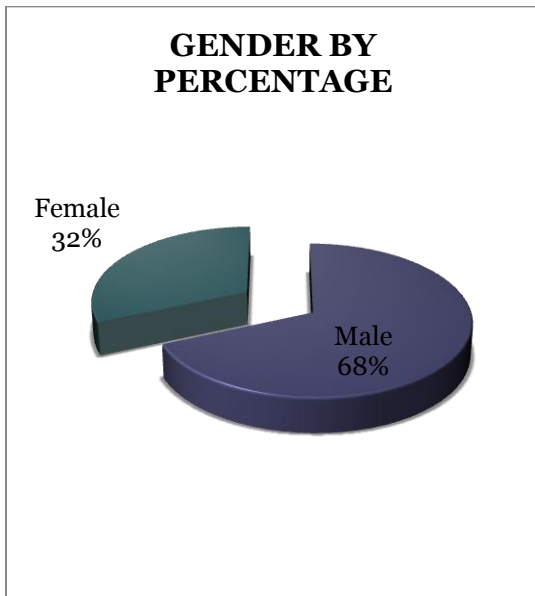
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ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

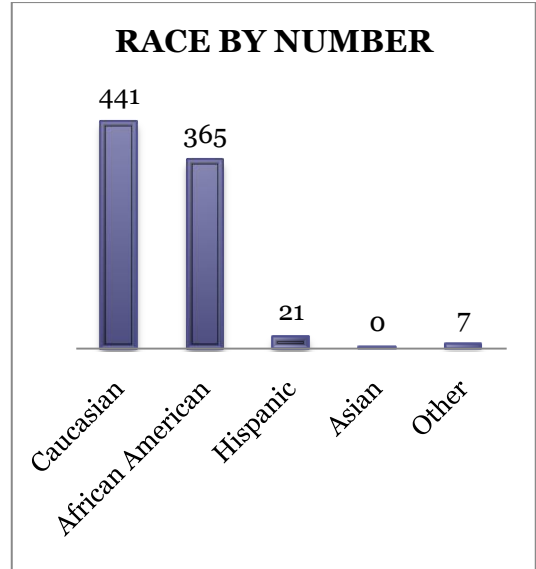
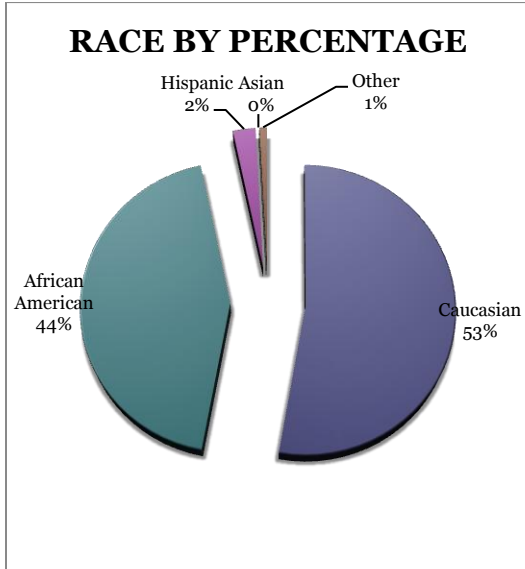
In October, there were a total of 834 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. Comparing with the last year's data for the month of October, there was a 9% decrease in arrests this month; that is 55 arrests per 100 crimes in October of this year, comparing to 54 arrests per 100 crimes last year, a 1%

increase for arrests per 100 crimes. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male ($n = 571$), as opposed to female ($n = 263$) and Caucasian ($n = 441$) and African American ($n = 365$) as opposed to Hispanic ($n = 21$), Asian ($n = 0$), or other/unknown/bi-racial ($n = 7$).



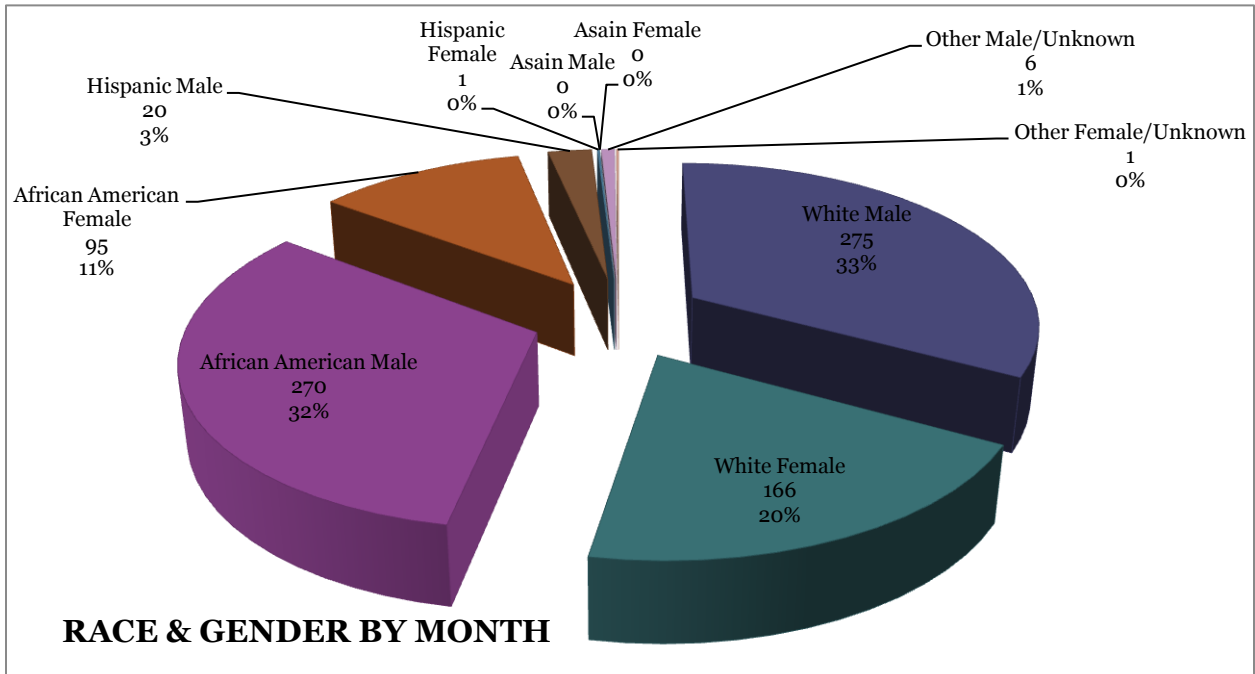
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Caucasian males make up the majority, 33%, of arrestees this month ($n = 275$). African American males make up 32% of arrestees for the month of October ($n = 270$). Caucasian females make up 20% ($n =$

166) and African American females make up 11% ($n = 95$). Hispanic males make up 3% ($n = 20$), and Hispanic Females make up 0% ($n = 1$) of arrestees.



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EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition,

this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency - 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same

district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division

is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

TRAFFIC

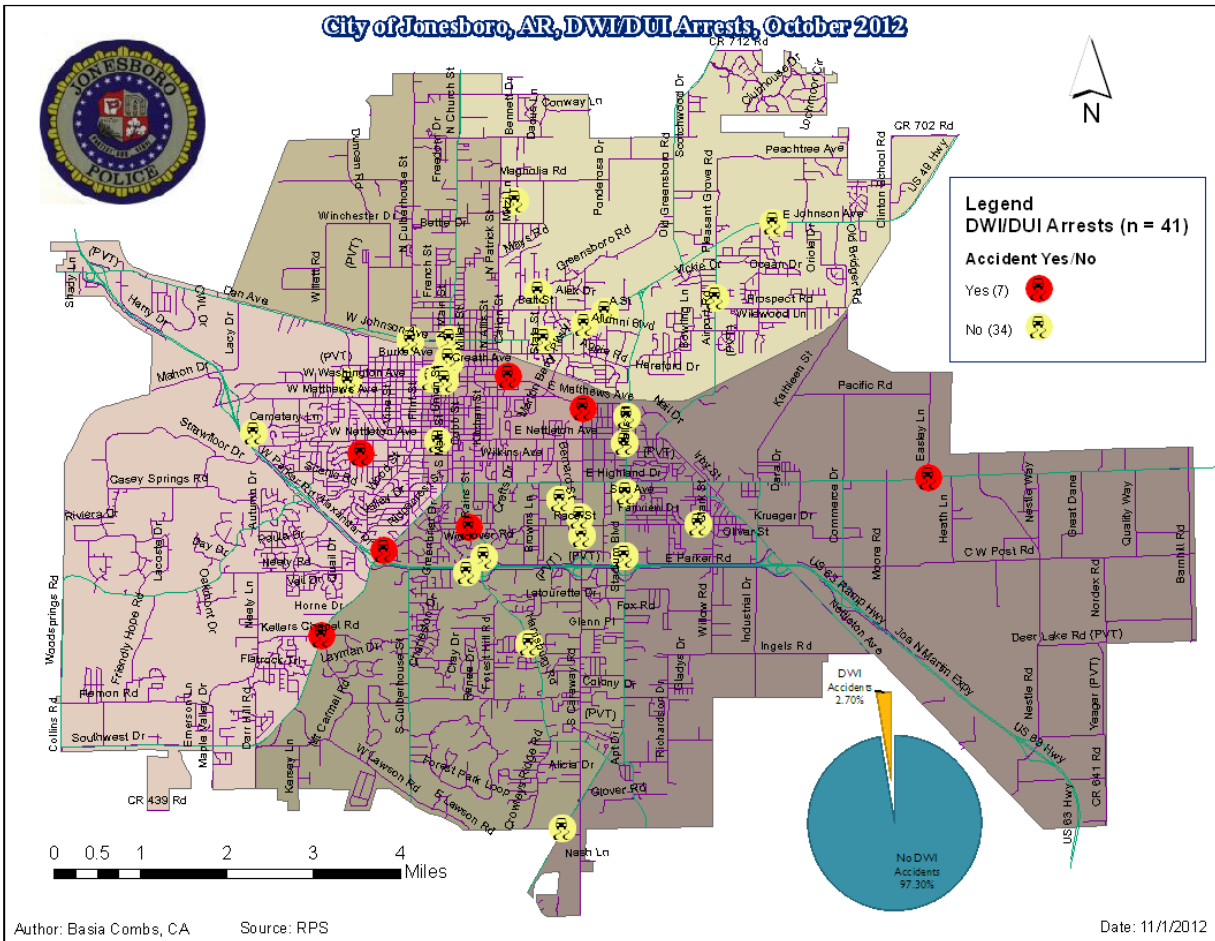

extra coverage for specific congestion problems and special events in the community. Last, they work details targeting specific issues, such as DWI enforcement and traffic safety checkpoints.

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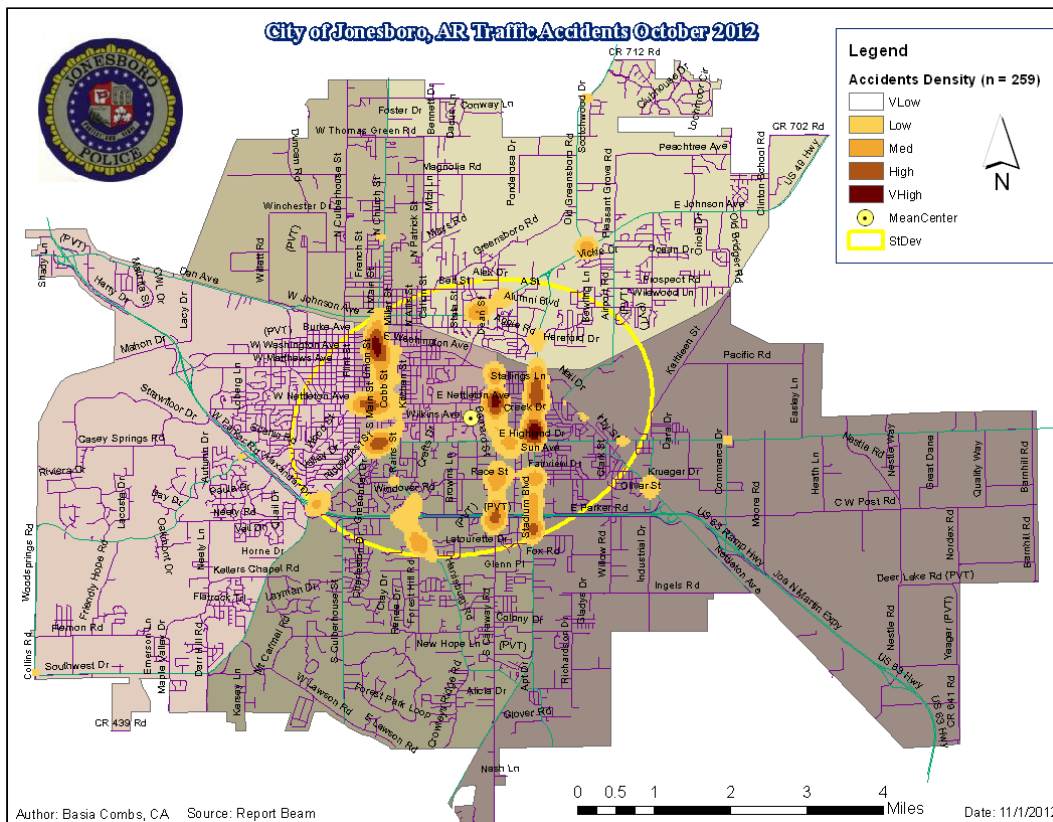
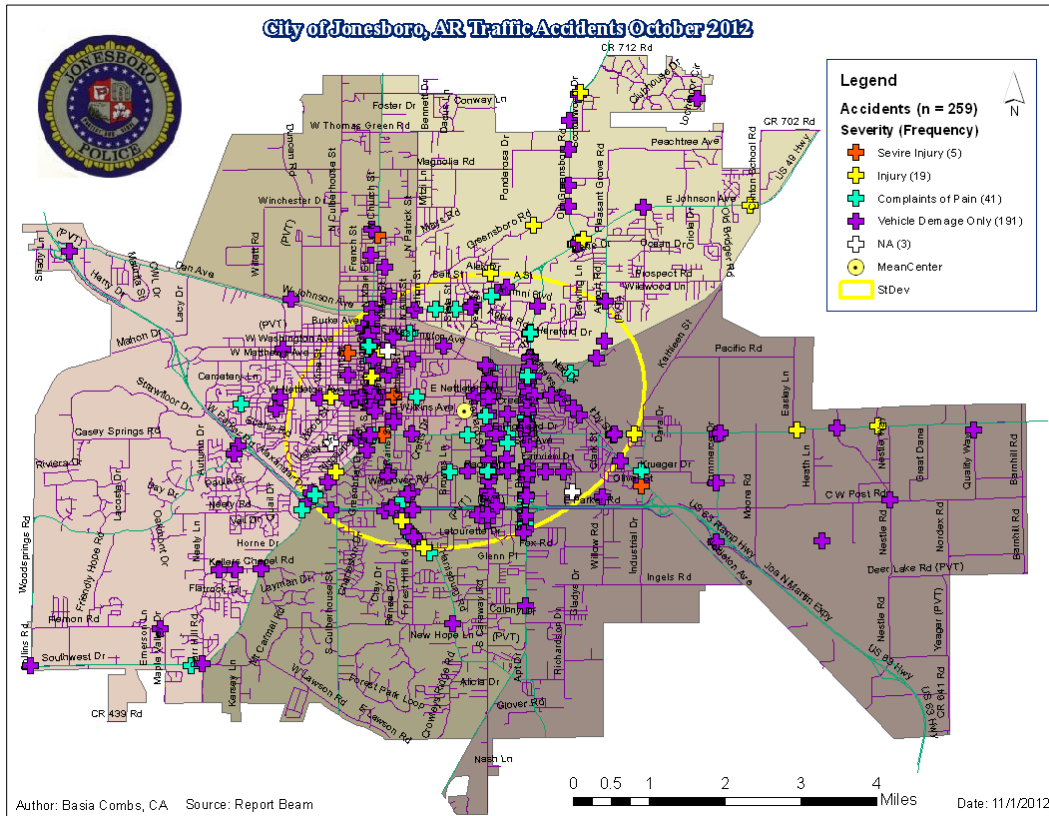
